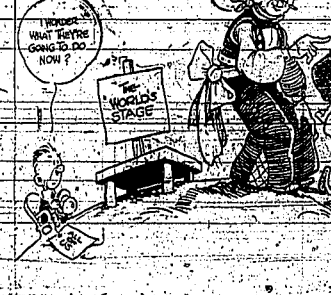

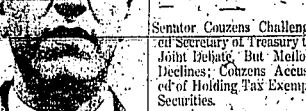

IDAHO AND UTAH DAIRYING

Every time some association of progressive farmers pool their finances to form a herd they stick into Idaho and Utah, a few of the ultra-conservative point to the remarkable growth of dairying in the two states with alarm, maintaining that they see the high of western states applying to national leadership in the dairy industry.

No one has ever advocated that everything be devoted to dairying. The introduction of dairy cattle was undertaken several years ago as an experiment along the lines of livestock production. It was so successful that its growth was inevitable. It will continue to expand for several reasons.

First, the climate and soil conditions are ideal for the production of feeds that give high milk and butterfat production; second, the region is a good, thickly settled land that these feeds can be grown cheaper; and third, there are few regions that have markets in all directions a veritable cornucopia of places where the products can be sent in large quantities for distribution.

These conditions make it possible for Idaho and Utah to compete with the larger states right in their dairy territories. To illustrate, butter and cheese from this section is going as far east as New York and as far south as the Pacific coast. This ability to reach the other coast with its market with a product of unquestionable quality makes the farmers well-versed in the dairy business and Utah look a paradise to the dairyman, but so far most of the dairy ventures are owned by the farmers who have found out that a few good producing cows and a flock of sheep are worth having on the ranch. Each of the two states now has about 100,000 cattle that measure up to the dairy standard and, in addition carry, say approximately 50,000 that are always counted as dairy cattle simply because they produce milk for the creameries and cheese factories.

Figures from the United States department of agriculture for 1922 show that Utah produced 5,013,000 pounds of butter, 9,210,000 pounds of cheese, 20,577,000 pounds of processed whole milk, and 10,000,000 gallons of cream.

The same year, Idaho's production amounted to 1,250,000 pounds of butter, 3,508,000 pounds of cheese, 10,061,000 pounds of processed whole milk, and 2,200,000 gallons of cream. Although the developments of the last two years show that Utah and Idaho can compete with the dairy states in the eastern markets, they are not in a commercial position to supply and meet the demand in the Pacific coast states for all supplies. It was not so long ago that butter and cheese from other sections were coming to Salt Lake, but the situation is different now.

Dairying is contributing much toward the return of prosperity. As long of dairying is conducted as one branch of a balanced farming program it will continue as such. The farmers for the most part have learned their lesson about the dangers of operating on one crop, and it is unlikely that the sudden riches from dairying will result in a heading plunge. There is still, in most cases, plenty of room for expansion without serious dangers.
