in the interest of better drama there is the influence of money behind these plays, we are convinced of that. Outside of New York and Chicago, and in our two other great centers of American drama, people are unable to satisfy that hunger. They have their picture houses, perhaps, and their musicals, and their variety shows, but it is not enough. That is why they clung so tenaciously to the old fashioned acting. They have no opportunity to see such plays, they usually satisfy their taste for the best drama by organizing amateur companies, and making extensive study of the drama in our universities. This, however, in the so-called commercial theatre the high class read shows are rapidly disappearing. There are many reasons for this. The first is that the weather makes it hard to attract an audience; in short, there is a dearth of dramatic development. Too many of them are written in a dead language and are ugly, coarse and beautiful in our theatres.

It is the realization of this need that has caused the success of the new plays. We hope to see more, more, more good drama in the future, and it is to be hoped that the public will accept it, because our sole financial support is the subscription of each of the men and women of our mind, and that is to present simply and sincerely.


