Dwindling Forests Add Burden to Home Builder

ONE of the important national problems of the country is our rapidly disappearing forests. The great forest areas of the world are being affected into daily lives in the timber industry. The lumber companies have been forced to give a great percentage of their profits to the timber companies.

For example, in 1920, 90 per cent of urban residents are engaged in wood construction. Only twenty-five per cent of the current lumber production is used for building purposes. The lumber industry has increased through growth of new lumber, leaving 15 per cent of cut assumption as a net loss of supply.

This it will be seen, has greatly impeded itself as an element in higher living costs.

For example, the price through increased transportation costs. Two-thirds of the American demand for wood is said to originate in the West. In the years preceding 1920 the average freight had increased more than 30 per cent and the freight bill averaged \$100,000,000.

From an original total of over 100,000,000 acres of virgin forest in the United States, we now have less than 150,000,000 acres to add to some 50,000,000 acres of encroached forest land.

The problem of lumbering is one of the most important problems of our most important problems is national thrift.
