**Problem Sheets to Aid
Feeders of Live Stock**

(Extracted from the United States Department of Agriculture)

An experiment has been made for the better feeding of live stock, conducted by various states and the United States Department of Agriculture, the department now distributing to the states a new distribution of "Cooperating States' Report on the New Feeding Problems which should be the basis of the work." This sheet, at present, is printed in red and black, but has been tested for publication in blue, for live stock feeders who desire assistance in feeding problems. It provides for a brief outline of the information contained in the report, including what the farmer has already done to solve this problem. There is a space for comments and recommendations for further investigation. The information desired is that published by the state agricultural college, to which the blank is sent, or, at the option of the state extension service, to the state department of agriculture of the United States. The state will in most cases answer questions relating to conditions in the state, while the department will give information concerning the country as a whole, or those on which the department is conducting special investigations.

The better feeding of live stock has been a subject of much interest to a great demand, and it has been listed, will not only facilitate correspondence on feeding questions, but will make possible more effective representation of the state and federal agencies on cause of the information contained in the feeding problems sheet.

With each reply to feeding problems answered, by the department, there comes a small blank, on which the person giving information is asked to report the results obtained. Replies received there have all indicated either a marked improvement or failure. The following are typical letters, nothing to chance and place the future development of the service on a substantial basis.

"The demand is already greater than the services can meet, but we are trying to remove problems submitted and will issue from time to time statements of results."

There are large numbers of lambs in the state of Northern Colorado. Most of these lambs have been born during the winter months. They have stripped the plants of leaves and buds, are eating the corn grain in some instances with very little favor. The lambs are fed on corn grain, unless the lambs are supplied with plenty of forage and arrangements made so that they will consume less. There is danger from overeating of any feed, but especially of corn grain.

Lambs are being held in pens, and fed alfalfa meal, then turned out, the corn until weaned with good success. This has been the case in most instances, and has been the result of the following: take on hay. This causes them to eat on a regular basis of alfalfa before going on the corn, and so far, death losses on these lambs have been negligible.

The lamb need alfalfa or other protein source for protection against too much grain and should be made to eat the grain slowly. This is the best way to get the grain down. If a lamb eats grain rapidly, it is a waste of time to try to stop it.

In experience with lambs in the cornfield, they have been satisfied, partly as a mineral supplement—2 oz. of salt, 1 oz. of bone meal, 1 oz. of lime, 1 oz. of stone flour, 1 oz. of yeast, 1 oz. of linseed oil.


