

The fine financial showing made by the play "Little Women" is not merely a tribute to the talent in the cast and to the Parent-Teacher association, but to the people who managed so well interest in the worthy enterprise which it was organized.

In deciding to make the "farmer's" institute at Hansen an annual affair the people of this community are to be complimented. It will mean enhanced interest in the theory and practice of scientific farming.

Everybody should attend the mass meeting at the high school auditorium Monday evening, where the facts regarding the financial condition of the district will be presented. The people of this district want the schools maintained at the high degree of efficiency which has always characterized them, and vague accusations reflecting on them and the honesty of expenditures will not beat a very demanded by conditions.

The determination of the board of county commissioners to enter into a drive against tuberculosis, as evidenced by the agreement reached last evening with veterinarians is a wise one. The statistics collected by the city inspector shows that the number of reactors also known to something like two-thirds of one percent among stock killed in the slaughter houses here. Under such circumstances, the cost of the campaign will be low all around. BOOSTING KNOCKERS

This (McAdoo platform) is somewhat of an ambitious program. By it McAdoo arrays his sympathy in his behalf from those against corruption in Washington, those in favor of strict enforcement of the Volstead law, veterans of the world war and the farmers. Against him he arrays that powerful influence known as Wall Street, the supporters of a protective tariff and last but by no means least a great army of voters in this country who are against the league of nations and interference in international political affairs. And the issues seems to be either out.

McAdoo will, of course, be a formidable candidate. Even those opposed to him politically and who are against his platform will admit that, "It will take the best man that the republicans can nominate to defeat him in the presidential election." Events are moving rapidly politically in this country. The people are standing on the side lines watching and waiting for the national political controversy to start. With McAdoo in the field and the moral certainty that President Coolidge will be the nominee of the Republican party a real fight-for presidential honors may be expected. Both are strong men—Capital News (Rep.).

Whether two-thirds of the delegates to the democratic national convention will be convinced that McAdoo is the best available number for nomination or not, it is certain that some wrangle will be at him now give very strong confirmation to the theory that there are lines when every knock is a blow. A few papers like the Postelle Tribune claim to fail to see the difference between the acts of Fall who betrayed his trust and betrayed the people as a public servant, and McAdoo who acted in the capacity of an honorable lawyer for a client who had dealings with Fall, in which McAdoo won in no way disgraced. However much voters may pity the moral opaqueness of vision of the Tribune, its opposition on this theory will hit with no horns with fair-minded folks.
