Identity of Individual Figuring in Messages May Become Known

Newly Obtained Messages Will Be of Much Help to the Committee in Rounding Down Clues and Bringing the Offenders to Speedy Justice; Numerous Facts Are Disclosed.

WASHINGTON, D. C., March 5.—Some three hundred additional telegrams, purloined by the Senate oil committee in executive session today opened a trail that may lead to identification of the "principal" mysterious person mentioned in several telegrams passing between E. B. McLean, Washington publisher, and his agents here.

Two committee members now say they have no doubt as to the persons' identity and believe the secret will now be fully disclosed.

FREAK WEATHER INJURES CROPS

Agricultural Department Completes Extensive Grain Report.

WASHINGTON, D. C., March 5.—The freakish weather of this past severe month has produced extensive damage to crops of winter grains, a survey just completed by the department of agriculture reports.

Delayed freezing and thawing throughout the heart of the grain belt, has produced a condition there which is described as being "very bad." Another cause was the lack of a snow cover to protect the seed grain sown in the autumn.
