WASHINGTON, D. C., March 5.—Some three hundred additional telegrams received by the senate oil committee in extensive session today opened a trail that may lead to identification of the "principal" mysterious person mentioned in several telegrams published between E. B. McLean, Washington publisher, and his agents here.

Two committee members now say they have no doubt as to the person's identity and believe open developments in this connection will follow shortly.

FREAK WEATHER INJURES CROPS

Agricultural Department Completes Extensive Grain Report

WASHINGTON, D. C., March 5.—The freak weather of the past several months has produced damaging results upon crops of wheat, grain, sorghum, and sugarcane by the department of agriculture.

Repeated freezing and thawing throughout the heat of the grain belt, the heavy snows, and the blizzards of the winter months have caused frost damage to wheat crops in many places.

The weather was most unfavorable to wheat, the chief crop of the grain belt, the report said. Winter oats also have suffered from freezing and thawing and in southern areas millet and sorghum crops in many places repeating is already in progress.

Reports from New Jersey, Pennsylvania, Virginia, North Carolina, South Carolina, Alabama, Tennessee, Indiana, West Virginia, North Carolina, and Oklahoma show great damage to wheat crops while in the Carolina areas crops have been damaged in places.

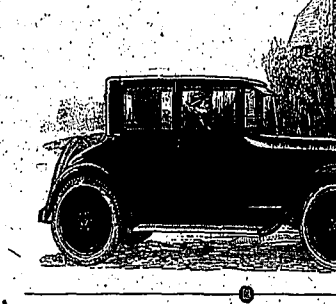

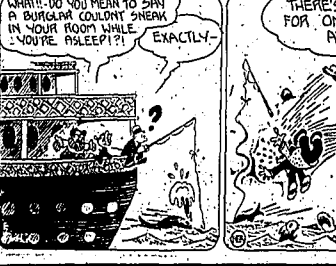

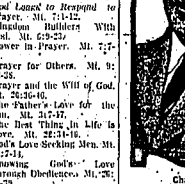
