Secretary Alger 25 years ago had to resign from the cabinet because of the "embalment" beef furnished to the soldiers in the Spanish war, yet Michigan promptly sent him back to Washington as a United States senator.

Frederick S. Dellepaigne, himself an explorer, says in a defense of the projected cruise of the Shenandoah that the voyage planned to the North pole at all, but to the vast area to the southwest of the pole. "An area that is southwest of the pole or any other direction but south must be a terra incognita indeed."

It is a cause for rejoicing to note that the horse is coming back into his own. The price, \$107.50, given for the animal at the Jester sale Tuesday shows that Dublin still has a place in the economy of production and development on the tract. This does not mean that there will be less machinery; it means a higher state of cultivation. The relation between the horse and his rivals is somewhat changed. The sort of labor performed by animals will differ somewhat. The horse will supplement the machine, instead of the machine supplementing the horse as in the days before the great war brought liquid depletion.

All parties concerned acted wisely in agreeing to arbitrate the questions involved in land values through which the highway must pass in the Murtagh district. In this an example was set for nations. If there had been an arbitration, there would have been litigation in which both parties would suffer loss. But even if that event, the issues would have been settled peacefully in courts, instead of being "shot out," as many justices were in civilized times. What we need in our international relations, is an application of the same principles that prevail in our relation with one another. War is not more rational than dueling. Those disputes which nations can arbitrate should be arbitrated. Those which either one or both parties should refuse to arbitrate should be settled before an impartial world court, such as that now existing in Europe. More, than the two parties who fight one another are involved in a contest of nations, the prosperity of the whole world is at stake. Unfortunately, the world has not learned the wisdom of the lesson which is understood and carried into effect by the people of Murtagh.

Wall street does not like McAdoo because it knows that it can expect no special privileges from him. The people have the choice of Mr. McAdoo or Mr. Wall Street and there is no doubt as to their decision.

# BINGHAM MINERS ASK WAGE INCREASE OF FIFTY CENTS A DAY

## Utah Copper Employees' Committee Meet and Ask for Wage Increase of Fifty Cents per Day. No Demand is Made on Company but Just a Plea for Higher Wage which Would Equal Other Camps.

(From Bingham Press-Bulletin.)

At a meeting of the General Employees' Committee of the Utah Copper held last Thursday evening, many important changes were discussed, one of which was the motion for an increase of fifty cents per day to every employe.

As has been stated, the employes' committee is composed of workers of the Utah Copper, and is an organization which was formed for the betterment of working conditions, and better wages. It is an organization composed of workers, and is not dictated by any officials of the company.

The motion as set forth asking for a raise is as follows. The Utah Copper, according to a statement given by one of the officials is not financially embarrassed, on the contrary, it is making money, and does not deny the fact.

"The men are asking for a fifty cent raise, and with 3200 men working on the hill at the present time it would amount to very little in comparison to the report for 1928 of the net earnings of the Utah Copper company.

"Having a fifty cent raise for all the employes, the Utah Copper would pay an increase of \$26,400 a month or a total of \$316,800 for the year.

"The 'boys' on the hill' as they are known, are not asking for the raise because it is given, they are just asking for that which is not just. They are all boys who are faithful to the Utah Copper, many of them being given the best years of their life to the company.

"They are to be commended for their manner in asking for the contemplation of the company. They demand nothing, merely suggest.

"That the raise is a just one is shown in the present conditions existing in the Bingham area. The man who is employed at a salary has a hard time making both ends meet. For instance, he receives his semi-monthly check of \$12.75, which amounts to \$25.50 per month. The average price asked of these laborers is \$25 a month for a room and one finds food costing 25 cents per day for less than 25 cents per month. It is this that is making a hard struggle. Under these conditions after the bare necessities of life are paid for, the man who works for a period of thirty days has a total of \$25.50. This leaves about five dollars a week for him to buy clothes, pay for a little recreation for his wife, and to give his wife a little play make Jack a little boy. It is a problem, to say the least, for the average worker to make both ends meet.

"And how about the fellow who has a family? Can he live on \$25.50 per month? We doubt it and therefore we feel that after the bare necessities of life are paid for, the conditions the raise will be forthcoming, and all will be well.

"A most pleasant feature of the present raise for an increased wage is the omission of the word strike, and all things pertaining to it. When asked what the employes' committee had to say on this matter, one worker said, 'I don't think the Utah Copper company will turn us down so it is a just request.'

## TRADE RECORD

### Trade of The United States With The Tropics

Big gains in our imports from tropical countries are being made. We take its raw materials and foods and pay for them in the products of our factories.

Trade of the United States with the tropical world has shown a remarkable growth since the beginning of the war. Whether or not it is because of the rearrangement of trade methods resulting from the direct from the tropical world (including our own tropical islands) as directed from approximately \$60,000,000 in 1913 to \$1,620,000,000 in 1932, while the exports to tropical products which followed \$400,000,000 in 1913, to approximately \$2,800,000,000 in 1932.

The Trade Record of The World Bank of New York, says, the Trade Record, that our trade with the tropics has increased approximately 130% in total tropical products prior to the war, and that it has now reached a point where it is at least \$2,800,000,000 in 1932, or 75% in the same period.

With the largest increase in the tropics has enormously increased. Practically all the tropical countries have increased the percentage of their exports to the United States. Our own official statistics show that our imports from Cuba advanced from \$125,000,000 in 1913 to \$300,000,000 in 1932. Considering as tropical or at least semi-tropical the American areas lying between northern Mexico and southern Brazil, the continent of Africa except the South African Union, and the countries and islands lying between northern India, the Philippines, Indonesia, and central Australia, the number of political divisions with which we interchange commodities—countries, colonies and islands—is 35, and our total value of merchandise brought to us from these areas in 1913 was \$1,620,000,000 in 1932.

The tropics occur in rubber, cocoa, sugar, coffee, cacao, and in the grain in exports to that area consist chiefly of manufactures.

This increase in our trade with the tropical world and especially in the market, which it offers, for the manufacture of tropical products adds the Trade Record, in view of the great possibilities of increasing the production and consequent buying power of that part of the world. The tropical and semi-tropical belt, extending the world around, however, the 30th parallel of north and south latitude, has over one third of the habitable land area of the world, much of which has larger producing power per acre than that of the temperate zones, and with the increased exploitation of its natural products which would follow improved transportation facilities by railways and automobiles would come an increased demand for the products of the American factories.

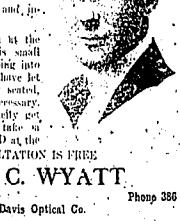

# CO-OPERATION ASKED IN TEST OF THE HERDS

Notice of the beginning of the test for tuberculosis with an appeal for hearty cooperation is contained in a letter sent out today by H. H. Hruschak, county agent, who refers to the advantages which will accrue from the test. The tests will start about March 17, under the auspices of the Twin Falls county extension, the board of county commissioners, the state bureau of animal industry and the federal department of agriculture.

In each of the 220 farms situated today, Mr. Hruschak says, owners should have their herds tested for tuberculosis. Tuberculosis has been found in several herds of cattle in the county.

The testing of all cattle in the county is of an economic as well as a healthful importance. It will increase the intrinsic value of such cattle as well as guard against the loss of income to the owner. It will also be a means of preventing the spread of the disease to other herds.

The testing is free of charge to all cattle owners, and where, in heretofore, it has been an annual test, it is now a permanent one. The state and federal departments of agriculture have agreed to share the cost of the test.

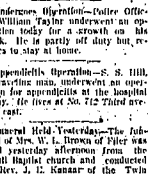
