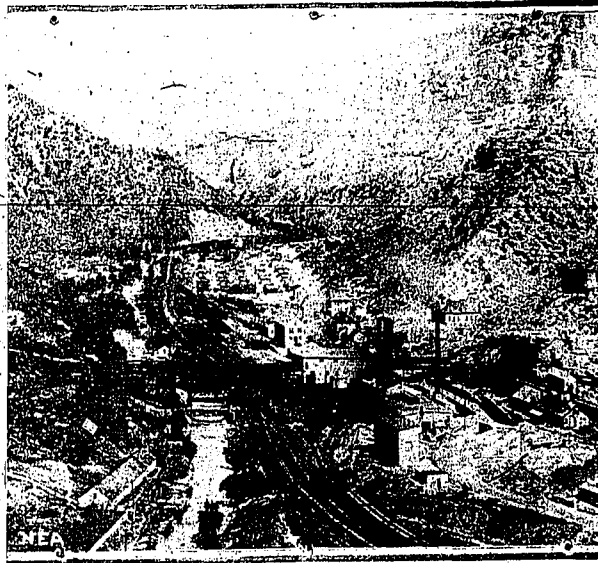

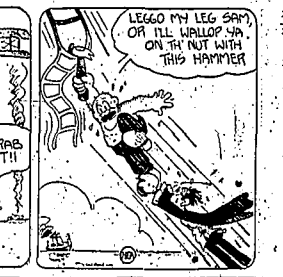
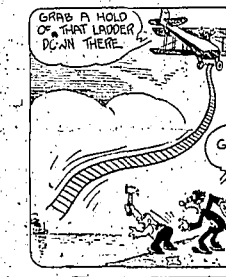

The Old Oregon Trail sign movement deserves to be judged through success. The old-time traveler with his ox team, who spent nights at his "inn" mixed with the songs of discontent. The modern traveler takes the comfort in imagination only. The only garage who fits him is the urban representative of the Standard Oil company in the gas station, who hits his own metaphorically speaking, with so much grace that being shined is a pleasure.

Isn't it a fact that the Oregon Short Line has guaranteed, as a condition essential to the transfer of the certificate of convenience and necessity of the Idaho-Central that it would build within a reasonable time? Has not the railroad company, representing the people of Twin Falls, a good deal of work to do in order to do so? Is it better to admit that the company is not doing its duty, if possible, but if this cannot be guaranteed, will not an appeal to the courts prove effective?

The policy of the county management is justified by results as shown by the figures compiled by the county auditor and made public yesterday. It is in line with the policy of efficient service at reasonable cost, without destroying the public service by paying a little and getting nothing. A similar policy in the city is resulting in a saving for taxpayers within the municipality. In addition to the positive savings shown by the figures, the decrease in the bonded debt is worthy of note. During the past year, the county bonded debt was only \$25,000. The city debt was decreased, \$15,500, besides a reduction of \$64,500 on special assessments. The total bonded indebtedness of the county and its various bonded enterprises is nearly \$200,000 less than a year ago. Altogether things are looking very promising.

IDAHO POWER RATES EXCESSIVE

There is a good deal of sharp criticism about the increase in the cost of electric power, since the rate has been advanced. It is said in defense of the rate that it is the most scientific ever put into effect and that it seems to be the case, as it comes as near getting "all that traffic will bear" as any ever laid. It is probable that the rate is considerably less than the point of maximum net return possible under non-regulative conditions, and to this extent the fight of the Southern Idaho Light & Power Users' association, which was ably represented at the last hearing by Captain Everett M. Sweeney, former chairman of the public utilities commission, was effective and beneficial. There is considerable talk about carrying the fight into the legislature to that body to set an arbitrary rate, lower than the one agreed on by the commission. This idea, tried out under the old maximum freight laws in Granger days, proved unsatisfactory and ineffective. In the last analysis the matter is one for the courts. Private property cannot be taken lightly without proper compensation, and confiscation is unconstitutional, whether in the form of arbitrary seizure or in the form of an attempt to set rates too low. Final adjustment by decision of the various public utility commissions is possible only in cases where both parties want to risk the issue. In this case. In case of arbitrary rate fixing, the courts will still pass on the reasonableness of the rate imposed. It would seem, therefore, that if the present rates are too high, in the opinion of the users, they should push that manifest through. The bodies represented in the light and power users' association and take the matter to the supreme court of Idaho; in which place it can go, directly, under the present constitution, without awaiting a hearing in the district court. Should the court hold the rates reasonable, there is no reason, except to buy tariff slips from the putting-trust or to become or purchase bonds from the Standard Oil company.

In justice to the supreme court of Idaho be it said that the decision rendered last year in the famous Bode restaurant cases, and the decision rendered last week in the close cases of the August Schuppens case against the Oregon Short Line, show that it is in no way inclined to decide in favor of big interests against the just claims of the more humble litigants.
