Committee Forced to Take Recess Because of Wheeler's Illness

HEARING TO BE RESUMED SOON

Will Delve Deeper Into the Mysterious Death of Jessie Smith.

WASHINGTON, March 24.—The scheduled hearing of the Senate Daugherty committee, which had been adjourned before meeting time by Chairman Brookhart Polk because of the illness of Senator Wheeler of Massachusetts, president of the committee, will be suspended until about half an hour and then, accompanied by many men and newspapermen, will go up to the navy department to take up its new duties.

"I am going now to pick up the threads of my new work," Polk said, leaving the White House. "I expect to find the navy department in a much more friendly atmosphere than I found it. I will try to step into and take over my duties as smoothly as possible."

The next session will be held Wednesday.

WASHINGTON, March 24.—The Senate Daugherty committee, though it recessed because of the illness of Senator Wheeler, will today decide what to do with the circumstances surrounding the death of Mrs. Jessie Smith, Attorney General Daugherty's law mate, friend who was found dead in her room at the Daugherty apartment, here last May.

Though Mrs. Jessie Smith's divorced wife, expressly denied any intention of killing at the possible murderer, Mrs. Smith will also testify.

Chairman Brookhart today announced that the committee had decided to itself

gate all phases of the alleged affair of Mrs. Jessie Smith, except the facts that she had died and performed at the time of her death.

While no subpoena has been issued for Dr. J. Ramsey Neill, District of Columbia coroner, Brookhart said he could be called to explain the failure of the coroner to present an autopsy report.

"There was no need of an autopsy," Dr. Neill told the United Press. "I was asked to give a certificate if I even knew of any possible cause of death. I did so, and no suspicious circumstances led me to issue a certificate of death by suicide without an autopsy."
