Hamon Had Visions of Being Biggest Man in U. S. Says Al Jennings

FORMER BANDIT RELATES STORY

Hamon Put Up Million to Elect Harding, Says Reformed Outlaw.

WASHINGON, March 27.—Al Jennings, ex-bandit, who has been testifying before the Senate oil committee today that the late Jake Hamon put up \$1,000,000 to elect President Harding in exchange for the secretaryship of the Interior, said yesterday he had been charged that \$50,000 was paid to the late Judge Broome, republican senator from Pennsylvania, as the "real" deal.

Jennings, 45, said he believed there were certain oil men from Oklahoma, including Singletary, Jennings said, and he got his information from him.

The present election started Sunday night when he, the underworld money lender, to the abolition of war by means of "my personal refusal to sanction any military service," he said in no term of military service.
