Washington, March 28.— President Coolidge today is looking for an attorney general, that through sheer force of public confidence, will probably be the next appointment to the cabinet. He has several prominent lawyers under consideration, but none of them has yet been given any special preference toward final selection.

He has selected Daugherty under unusual circumstances, Mr. Coolidge will select a man to the head of the department who will measure up in every way to the position, the president's office believes.


