CLEAN ATHLETICS

(From Bingham-Pres. Bulletin.)

Last week the L. D. S. U. school held an assembly in which it made known to the outside world that it had been playing an ineligible player on its basketball team, the team that won the state title. At the assembly, the school relinquished its right to be called state champs, relinquished its right to go to Chicago for the big tournament and is at the present time the subject of much discussion and puzzling.

It is not the aim of this paper to dwell upon the fact that Max Foote, of the L. D. S. U. school was over 21 years of age when the school year opened last September, and it is not our aim to try and ridicule the unfortunate team and school, but we would like to ask a few questions concerning the ethics of the state athletic association which is supposed to be at the head of high school athletics.

First, we would like to know how an ineligible player can get away with that sort of thing, with a felonious supposed to be watching for just those things? How can a slip such as the case of Max Foote escape the ever-watchful eye of the eligibility department of the association?

It is claimed that the registration card of Foote's had been tampered with, "All legal and good, but why didn't those who discovered the fact, tell him, BEFORE the Saints were allowed to proclaim state champions, and allowed to compete throughout the basketball season? What school or individual became peevish at the winging L. D. S. U. team and split the blame?"

Certainly the L. D. S. U. faculty is not composed of blind persons, who would be unable to see that a registration card had been tampered with.

Why, or why, did the school allow Foote to play? What is the result naturally upon the other schools of the state?

What is gained with the winning of a championship under false colors? Oh, the folly of it all, and yet the L. D. S. U. school is not the first school that has been found using such tactics to win a title.

Bingham, the team that, for the past six years has sent a team to compete in the state tournament, has yet to bring home the coveted title, but it has always tried to live up to the riglings of the state high school officials.

Bingham has been accused of being the home of a rotten bunch of sports, but think heaven, with all our so-called rotteness, we did not try to slip in any ringers at the state tournament. The fact of the matter is that a man smart enough to get just the eligibility board of the state has never been located, and the people of Bingham are not looking for him either.

There are many lads in Bingham at the present time, who, in years gone by, have fought for the blue and white, and are now playing with the Utah Copper basketball team, and would have aided materially in the last state tournament in bringing the flag to Bingham.

It is rather disconcerting, to say the least, to take a team to the state tournament year in and year out, and never a championship, but it hurts considerably more to have ineligible players here to win the title.

And now, we fail would ask one more question of the powers that be: Why was Panglithel awarded the state championship? Here in Bingham, away from the beaten path, away from the rest of the world, many of us know but little more than the law allows, and yet our conception of the controversy is that while a team is found to be playing an ineligible player, every game in which said team participated is thrown out; this finds that the South Summit-Saints game, the Jordan-Saints game, and in fact, all four games in which the Saints participants are nil, and rightfully, there should not be a state championship awarded in the state this year.

And this writing, Panglithel is in Chicago, and it is our hope that the Garfield County quibled under the able guidance of Conch Church, bring home the championship of the United States. We want it known that Utah does, in every way, even in its athletes, but we also want the world to know that said championship was won on merit and honest, athletics.

Perhaps the state board of control of high school athletics in answering our questions would like a few suggestions, so we are going to let the liberty of suggesting: First, that the honorable board declare no championship be awarded any team for the 1924 basketball season; second, that the L. D. S. U. school be suspended for the period of one year from participating in any branch of scholastic athletics. This, on the surface may sound a trifling severe, but will be a trifling severe, but will prove to be an incentive for other schools who may not, in some future time, try and slip one over.

But be it as it may, we wish to doff our bonnet to the Bingham high school, to Principal Lars W. Nielsen, to Coach Tommy McMullin, to the players on the team, and to the students who have supported that, OLEMAN ATHLETICS.

The putting of a larger park "Ave" this year, at a slight increase in cost, is a commendable act of the Twin Falls Chamber of Commerce and one that will be appreciated by the tourist.

Baldson's report showing that Twin Falls stands high among cities of the intermountain and coast country in regard to business conditions, is another encouraging strain. It is a reflection of the bank clearing and other signs of the times here.

In the French yellow book on the Rhine land question, which was published Saturday after some delay, the public is likely to be chiefly interested in the text of the Wilson-Clementon correspondence, while Lloyd George really called a secret agreement, but the volume as a whole may give the students of history something to digest.

The New Jersey Methodist conference on Saturday removed the ban on theorizing and duncing from the "judicatory section" of the discipline leaving it only in the advisory section. That is, it removed the penalty of expelling for repeated indulgence, while retaining the attitude of disapproval. This marked forward step in liberation is to come before the general conference at Spring Field, where action will be awaited with much interest.

It is distressing news that Miss Mary Cassatt, the noted American painter, who made her home for nearly half a century in Paris, is circumscribed with blindness. She is selling all of her pictures and is to return to this country. Miss Cassatt was born in Pittsburgh in 1855, studied art in Philadelphia, Paris, Spain, Austria and Rome. Her first Paris Salon picture was exhibited when she was 12 and her success has been continuous.

That the Twin Falls high school debaters know their subject is indicated by the fact that our team won two debates out of three, thus giving this high school the championship of this division. However, to allow a small sum like \$20,000 to keep us from our goal would appear to be foolishness of the direct sort.

IS POWER CONTRACT VOIDABLE?

Some citizens are exercised over the report that the lighting contract between the city and the Idaho Power company was automatically abrogated by the change of rates? No valid contract with a public service corporation under the public utility law can be, as abrogated, since the right to alter rates up or down is reserved in every such contract by implication if not by specific statement. Otherwise, a public service monopoly might make a contract which would be in substance discriminatory in favor of some allied interest and the commission would be powerless. The city contract is, therefore, void out on this ground. Individually, the same principle which applies in this case renders it useless to protect against future increases of the long time contract now offered by the power company unless it should be expressly stated that the contract therein would be abrogated by an order of the commission raising the rate.

But some lawyers are inclined to think that the city contract with the power company for lighting may be voidable at the discretion of the city on the ground that it was entered into for a longer period than is permitted by statute in the case of municipal corporations. This is a matter into which the city may be called upon to look in the event that a better contract should be offered from some other source. The effect of the right of the commission to raise rates in any existing contract on long time contracts has been referred to on several occasions in these columns and is well worth the consideration of all who may be inclined to sign them. They afford no protection against my future action of the commission.
