GOODING ASKS INVESTIGATION ON WAR LOANS

Wheeler Investigation Committee Will Be Heard in Idaho Senator's Work, Has Started.

Idaho Senator Will Ask Senatorial Investigation of Charges Made by Pomona Grange Concerning War Loans Given Him as a Special Favor.

WASHINGTON, April 10— In a question of personal privilege in the Senate today, Senator Gooding, Idaho, in a request demanding an investigation of the charges made by the Pomona Grange concerning war loans given him as a special favor.

Gooding's resolution was referred to the Committee on Small and Independent Business.

WASHINGTON, April 10— In a question of personal privilege in the Senate today, Senator Gooding, Idaho, in a request demanding an investigation of the charges made by the Pomona Grange of Idaho that he was favored by the war finance corporation in obtaining large loans for agriculture, referred the resolution to the Committee on Small and Independent Business.

Gooding said the only loans he retained were \$2,629 for himself; \$1,500 for W. F. Gooding; \$2,500 for H. T. Gooding and all the loans have been repaid.

Information was reported to have charged that Gooding, Senator Blodgett of Oregon and their relatives had received loans of over \$1,000,000, or one-tenth of the total amount loaned by the war finance corporation in Idaho, which was not true, he said.

Gooding said the small farmer did not get "cheap" loans in 1921, he said, the family was barely alive then.

The testimony of Fred A. Koenig of Chicago, director of the Holstein-Friesian association, to the effect that Twin Falls deserved to become one of the greatest dairy centers in the country, adds another competent witness to the long list that have made similar statements. Mr. Koenig made this declaration after a careful survey of the conditions here.

The opening of a retail store up by the Kinney Wholesale Agency indicates confidence in the rapid and steady future growth of Twin Falls by a firm which has been here fifteen years and knows conditions. As stated, this departure involves no change in the wholesale business of the firm, which will still continue at the enlarged headquarters built up by years of successful development.

"This number," said Mr. Davis, "is based upon a list supplied to Legion headquarters by the war department, showing the names and states of residence of all men who died to verify this list before the names of Idaho's dead are drawn upon the lineage tablets that will line the 'hall of fame' in the Memorial Building." The list, said Mr. Davis, shows the organization of every community and organization in Idaho will be requested.

A total of 2,000 claimants to the lineage tablets, including the deceased, project is almost complete, and will be announced within the next few weeks.

"Offers of cooperation and support are being received from every quarter of the state," said Mr. Davis, in his report to the board.
