Smith Promises Efficiency If Elected to Presidency

ALBANY, N. Y., April 16.—Governor Alfred E. Smith of New York state today is a candidate for the democratic presidential nomination. Many of his first public utterances on the question, which has been agitated with varying degrees of strength in recent days, have given him a decided edge, speaking before the democratic delegating convention here, in the understanding that he will be nominated in the usual way.

WASHINGTON, D. C., April 16.—The Senate yesterday voted to include Japanese exclusion provisions in the pending immigration bill by a vote of 71 to 4.

Senators from California, Illinois, New York, Indiana, and Connecticut, however, had been absent yesterday, when the vote was taken, so that the bill, as it stands now, has been referred and a recent vote, taken.

Senators Stearns, Cole, Warren of Wyoming, and others, all republicans, were against the provision.

TOKIO, Japan, April 16.—Year after year, the Japanese excluded by the United States "will undoubtedly remain here," said the Foreign Minister of Japan, in a speech in which he set forth in which we have been hasty to return you," was expressed yesterday by Baron Shibusawa, Japanese foreign minister, in an interview with American press representatives.

GOOD ROAD PLAN FEATURED AT THE CHAMBER MEETING

Road improvement between Twin Falls and Jarbridge was approved, establishment of tourist stations recommended, and a Wells Fargo office established at Green River, Wyo., by the Idaho Automobile Association, approved right-of-way for the proposed highway from the coast to the grand stand and making other improvements voted, appreciation of efforts of the chamber of commerce for the right-of-way was voted, and the Idaho State Fair festival association for work for the right-of-way was voted.

July 4 celebration was referred to a committee; J. W. C. Deake was chosen tourist park chairman, and H. E. Johnson, president of the park on the directorate made vacant by the resignation of Curtis Turner at a meeting of the Chamber of commerce, elected last night.
