

EXPLANATION PROVISION IS FLOORED

Senate Goes on Record As Advocating Japanese Exclusion; Only Four Out of Seventy-Five Men Vote Against the Provision

WASHINGTON, D. C., April 15.—The senate today reaffirmed its decision to include a restrictive provision in the pending immigration bill by a vote of 73 to 4.

Upon the report of Senator Sherman, South Dakota, and Col. Hodge, Idaho, which they had passed almost unanimously, the vote on the provision occurred, a record vote was entered and a record was taken.

Senators Steiwer, Colt, Warren, McPherson and Michael, Connecticut, all Republicans, were against the provision.




