THE BONUS BILL CARRIES (By JAMES D. WHELAN)

The passage of the bonus bill over the veto of President Coolidge will doubtless give a feeling of relief to the president and to his lieutenant, Senator William E. Borah, paradoxical as that statement may seem. So long as the bonus bill has before Congress it kept up a fight for its passage among services. Now that it is the law, the tendency will be to divert attention to other issues and the powerful republican, trust machine, which is already working with some success to get apparently innocent, but really loaded resolutions through all sorts of non-partisan organizations, will not be slow to divert attention to other sources of controversy. In addition to this an appeal will be made for both the president and the senator on the ground that they showed rare courage in taking the stand which they did.

However, the issue will still have considerable influence both in Idaho and in the nation this fall and the veto of the president and the vote of congress will both have effect in different ways. On the one hand, it will give the trustee which tipped the house for both Coolidge and Borah more strength than ever. On the other it will draw water to the McClellan mill in the democratic contention.

For while Borah voted for the bonus, McClellan has been as conspicuous in his advocacy of the bonus as he has been in his advocacy of the law enforcement and of progressive measures, and if there is to be a difference at all it will be good politics to accentuate it as much as possible.

Underwood voted against the bonus, as did Glass, who was looked upon as being as the feasible beneficiary of the McClellan program, and the latter failed to get the number of delegates required to get him over.

The writer has personally and persistently advised the house to change the law enforcement and to make it more than ever to forward it in congress, and, that as the word bonus is derived from the Latin, means good, and as now used, denotes "An allowance in addition to what is actual, current or stipulated as a bonus to an employee"; so the people of the United States should voluntarily vote such allowance above the technical, stipulated wages in appreciation of the services of those who risked everything for their country, and served it so worthily. Perhaps had more of the advocates urged this line of argument strongly, the measure would have met with less opposition in some quarters than it did.

SHOULD TRY BIMETALLISM

This is the time to try the better cells gold mining stocks. Austria, Russia and Germany are using ironing tools to replace their worn-out and worthless war currencies. This is a step in the right direction and it will doubtless be followed by all continental European countries in the near future.

The world's production of silver for 1923 was 222,000,000 ounces; of this India and China consumed 200,000,000 ounces; they will need a greater amount for 1924. The world will produce less silver this year than last. Why? Because the copper-mining of the United States has, since January 1, continued to expand its operations 40 per cent below that of 1923. The only question is there is an unlimited demand for all of the gold the world can produce at \$2067 an ounce. 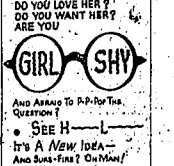
