LA FOLLETTE MOVEMENT DRAWS MORE WATER TO M'ADOO WHEEL

(By JAMES D. WHEATON.)

The attitude of Robert M'LaFollette as defined in his letter of yesterday, will tend, like the veto of the house bill by President Coolidge, to carry more water to the M'Adoo mill, whatever interpretation may be placed upon it. The most reasonable construction to be placed on LaFollette's letter is that he expects to be a candidate on the progressive ticket. In that case, he will draw to his support a very large wet element and will render the nomination of a moist candidate on the democratic ticket even more doubtful than would otherwise be the case. This does not mean LaFollette will not pledge himself to support the constitution and to enforce the law, or that he will not be honest in making such pledges; possibly he will give such pledges and mean them. But Wisconsin has been notoriously wet and LaFollette has been with his state. Should LaFollette run he would divide the wet vote with a wet democrat, should the party be unable to nominate one. On the other hand, a dry democrat would be certain to carry the solid south, and if sufficiently progressive would carry the west. In other words, a progressive dry democrat can carry the south and west as Wilson did in 1916 and he pleads.

M'Adoo is today the one outstanding dry, progressive democrat, who is in favor of the lounge. Nevada has followed Idaho this week and after endorsing M'Adoo, sent an un instructed delegate of M'Adoo boosters to New York. Personally, the writer prefers instructions to endorsements, but with the drift the way it is, there is no real difference. Instructions are not new in the democratic party. More than any other great leader Stephan A. Douglas adhered to the practice of being governed by them, taking a position diagnostically opposite to that of Borah in regard to the binding character of platforms and popular mandates.

The political "stars in their courses" are fighting for M'Adoo. Should LaFollette carry enough states to throw the presidential election into congress, the democrat would win, for the permanence of democratic control by states was assured when the progressive republicans refused to vote with the "Old Guard" to out a democrat in New York state.

FISHING IN ROCK CREEK WILL OPEN BELOW THE SYPHON

Rules Governing Opening of Streams on Date of June First Are Jittered to Public; Other Streams Outside Forest Reserve Will Remain Closed.

Word has been received by W. R. Price, president of the Southern Idaho Game Association, that Rock creek will open for fishing below the syphon just June first. Request was made of the Idaho Fish and Game department by the local association to have the opening of the stream, but only part of the stream below the syphon was designated for fishing. There has been some misunderstanding regarding the order, and whether it will be open or closed to fishing in Rock creek also. Mr. Price states that it definitely means that the tributaries are now open for fishing since.

The association expects to stock the two tributaries, Deadman's Gulch and Hightooth Gulch "creek will" native, rainbow and brook trout. Its return to fishing date is the 1st of July. Section 274 of the Compiled Statutes says: "It shall be a misdemeanor to fish within three hundred feet of a fish ladder or dam in any stream."

There is a fish ladder at the syphon. All other streams, outside the Minidoka forest reserve, except as qualified above will open June 1, but those in the forest reserve remain closed.
