DAUGHERTY REFUSES TO TESTIFY

**Former Attorney General
Refused to Appear Before
Senate Investigating Com-
mittee; Claims They Are
Trying to Blacken Name.**

WASHINGTON, June 4.—Harry L. Daugherty, former attorney general, today refused to appear before the Senate investigating committee to testify because it was without authority to conduct the investigation.

Daugherty's refusal face his accusers in a letter to Chairman Brookhart, read by Paul B. Howland, his attorney.

In his letter, he refused to appear on the decision of Judge Cochran in the lassus case of Earl Warren, former member of the former attorney general's staff.

A sweeping denial of all "illegal, corrupt or criminal conduct" as well as a defense was made in entirety in his letter.

Brookhart, who has been investigating as a "desperate attempt to blacken his character and without team val- uity," formally called the Oregoner to appear in the Senate on June 10, but Daugherty refused to appear in person before it to answer charges made and denied conduct of the department of justice.

Daugherty, moreover, withheld his name from the Senate investigating committee.

He described the committee as antagonistic to him and said the court order, which freed his brother, Daugherty, from the Senate, did not oblige him to appear before the committee's order to appear, made it unnecessary for him to do so or to appear before the Senate.

Daugherty's letter, dated Washington, presented to Chairman Brookhart by Paul P. Howland, his attorney.

He denied all sorts of charges laid against him and said he had no knowledge that no evidence of such had been presented Washington except by word of mouth.

The silence of the tomb has forced the direct denial of the charge that he was responsible for the standards imposed on the Senate.

To provide facilities for study by physicists of the United States and other countries at the research laboratory of the University of Copenhagen—the Rockefeller International Education board has given \$10,000 for the enlargement and further equipment of the university's institute for theoretical physics. The award followed a series of six lectures at Yale university by Dr. Niels Bohr, director of the institute, in which he presented his discoveries on the nature of the structure of the atom and the convolutions of the electrons within the atom.

The first vacation recreation schools provided by a resolution of the National Council of Education in November, 1923, have just completed their terms. Under this resolution 32 vacation schools in Districts Aire are to function annually between December 15 and February 15. There are two sessions each day of two and one-half hours each, boys attending in the morning and girls in the afternoon. No school may have an enrollment to exceed 150 pupils nor continue with less than 50. The program includes physical education, games, respiratory exercises, free play and work method; school songs; reading under the direction of a teacher; moving pictures; excursions; and theatrical programs for children.

If every interested tourist could be made to realize the value of farm land of the Twin Falls tract, the park would be a million dollar advertising scheme. The trade possibilities of the tourist park justify a brilliant business manager.

The tourist mind is a complex of vagaries, complacency, and vision. Every phase of mentality and units in unfavorable propaganda. The point of contact of the community and this transient population is the park management. To utilize the advertising possibilities of the park all political, social and religious elements must be appealed to if we would commercialize this opportunity. There is an unanimous political protestant sentiment in the shakers of 1923. To be sure of harmony it is only necessary to admit that everything is appraised in the whole political world—that the social world is menaced by a flood of crime, and that the religious world is "fundamentally" confused.

MUNARY-HAUGEN BILL POOR MEASURE

The McNary-Haugen bill which was defeated yesterday had powerful backing, but its foes while representing widely divergent elements, were able to beat it, largely because of its inherent weakness and essential unsoundness.

Congressman Bailey of Illinois, a Democratic farmer, representing a farmer constituency, summed up the case when he said, in opposing the measure:

"Many are supporting this bill on the ground that there has been nothing better offered for farm relief. I am opposing it on the ground that nothing worse could be offered."

The American Farm Bureau association, mildly endorsed the bill as offering possible relief, and the Grange also gave it weak approval, while the Farmers' National council assailed it as weak and wretched, the Farm Bureau and the Grange for their attitude. After commenting on the Farm, Bureau's stand at length the Farmers' National council in a statement said:

The National Grange is also in a weak-kneed way backing it, and the National Farmers' Union is giving a modified assent to the measure. The real effect and only effect of the McNary-Haugen bill is to kill any real measure of relief for farmers.

The McNary-Haugen bill:

Establishes a system of conserving farm crops.

Creates a system of scrip through which the farmers are compelled to pay taxes on exports claimed by the processors of certain farm products handled by the corporation.

Hypothetically pretends to pay farmers a pre-war ratio price, and farmers were going broke then, while in fact it will probably pay them only a maximum of three-fourths of such price.

Leaves the publishers in control of farm products.

Invites graft, waste, and inefficiency through its intermittent operation.

The McNary-Haugen bill cannot pass the senate, and the house. The chairman of the tariff commission has stated it is unconstitutional. Republican leaders and the men back it know that it is, and will be thrown out of the court.

The McNary-Haugen bill is a hypocritical move to enable public leaders to say that they have passed a measure to help the farmers so as to try to carry the next election, and then pass the buck to the courts.
