HOW FOREST FIRE EVIDENCE WAS OBTAINED

An interesting example of detective work in the Forest Service recently occurred in California, when officers of the Forest Service secured evidence against an automobilist who violated the campfire regulations before the camp fire was even built. This sounds like Sherlock Holmes, but here is how it happened.

A tourist from one of the Eastern States established a temporary camp in the Trinity National Forest, Calif. On an inspection-trip a forest ranger photographed this particular camp to secure a picture for use in a report on camping sites in his district.

A few days later this ranger was called out to fight a forest fire that had plainly started from a camp fire left burning by some careless camper who had moved on to parts unknown. The ranger remembered having included an automobile in the photograph he had taken of this particular camp site a few days before. Hurrying back to headquarters he examined the negative, and with the aid of a magnifying glass picked out the number of the license plate on the pictured automobile. He then sent a description-over the telephone to adjacent towns and the ranger stations and landed his man, who admitted his carelessness, paid his fine, and continued on his way with a new appreciation of what was meant by "Be sure your campfire is out—then bury it."

RIDDLE OF WHY YOU LIVE

The Great Mystery is what becomes of us after we die, but why we live at all. Through all the centuries man has sought to penetrate the black curtain and learn what awaits him in the Hereafter.

By the law of cause and effect, the condition in the Hereafter depends on the life we live Here.

All religions of large followings agree that this life is preparatory to what follows after death. This is true from the Christian believing that Heaven awaits him if he behaves and obeys the rules, to the oriental who fears that if he doesn't live properly on earth he will have to come back and do it all over again.

Life must have a definite purpose. It cannot be aimless. Everything has a purpose—even the falling of a dead tree to fertilize the soil and send its strength back into the tree from which it came.

Life is a journey between two unknown stations. Life is a training school—a spiritual gymnasium, in which obstacles and temptations are sent to develop our spiritual strength.

We come into this world with certain definite tasks to do. These tasks are in proportion to our natural abilities.

The man who is destined to dig ditches all his life and who does the best he can, is as much a success as the man who leads the people politically, or as head of giant industries. The thorough ditch digger, living as a good citizen, is a far greater success than the man who, given great power in life, abuses his power or fails to use it for the accomplishment of good.

Success is not a thing that can be measured by any universal yardstick. It is relative to our natural abilities and opportunities.

UNIVERSITIES GET \$70,000,000 IN GIFTS

State universities of America have received more than seventy million dollars in gifts from private sources, according to information compiled by the University of Oregon. Returns from 43 state institutions show gifts totalling \$70,187,654, varying in size from a single gift of \$2,000 to the new Alaska Agricultural College and School of Mines to gifts totalling \$25,000,000 received by the University of Michigan and \$13,000,000 by the University of California. Michigan reports the largest single gift, a bequest of \$18,000,000.

"An impressive feature of these returns is the large number of small gifts they show," said Prince L. Campbell, president of the University of Oregon. "Gifts of a few thousand, a few hundred dollars and less show that the citizen of moderate means is beginning to enjoy all the pleasures of philanthropy that were formerly the exclusive privilege of the very rich. The state university is a peculiarly appropriate beneficiary for these gifts for it exists not to give education to the few but to every person who is qualified to profit by its advantages."

"The demands made upon state universities, especially in the rapidly growing western states, are so heavy that it appears that legislative support will always lag behind actual needs. Like other state universities, Oregon had to launch a public gift campaign to be the only solution of its financial problem. Because we have determined not to 'wholesale' education, despite increasing numbers of students, our entire income is required for purposes of instruction and we have turned to the public for \$6,000,000 to meet our building needs. A score of state universities have successfully con-

ducted financial campaigns for buildings or endowment. So many have built stadiums that some educators have come to the conclusion that alumni will not subscribe money for anything else. Such is not the case. The alumni are interested in anything affecting the welfare of their university, if the need is really urgent. For example, University of Georgia alumni raised \$1,200,000 for such prosaic items as a physics building, an animal husbandry building, dormitory and endowment to raise professors' salaries."
