

ONE NEMA PARASITIC IN ANOTHER

The investigation of nemas, small organisms of great economic importance to agriculture, is work requiring the attention of highly-skilled scientists. In recent years much valuable information has been unearthed regarding these threadlike organisms which, in most of the species, are so

threadlike organisms which, in most of the species, are so small as to be seen only with great difficulty by the unassisted eye. Very many of the forms are parasitle in plants, insects, animals, and man. Some of them are hyperficial because of their attacks on destructive tendencies. A short time ago scieptists in the United States Department of Agriculture made an important new discovery regarding risms, and the way in which this work was done shows just how difficult it is sometimes to get the story of their lives. They found one "enormously small" menh parasitic inside of, another very small one; the first instance in the many years during which these organisms have been studied that ar' truly parasite relationship of this kind, has been found to exist.
