FUSION IS ONLY HOPE OF DEMOCRATS IN IDAHO

While reports are being circulated from one end of Idaho to the other against fusion of the Democratic party with the Progressive party, yet as we look over the political horizon this is the only chance that the Democratic party has of victory in the coming campaign in the Gem State. Generally speaking we are opposed to fusion, but when the cause looks as hopeless as it does at present the only alternative is fusion or defeat. We believe that the Progressives headed by Samuels will be willing to give the Democrats the balance of the state ticket if we nominate him for governor and if this agreement can be brought about the fusion ticket will be elected.

This is the only hope of defeating the Republican party, which is under the dictation of the Idaho Power trust and other predatory interests of this western country. Democratic leaders and Progressives had just as well sit down and count the cost early in the campaign because the mistake which these two political parties made in 1922 stands out in bold relief against the horizon today so boldly that we cannot erase the lesson from our minds at this hour.

If the Democratic party and the Progressive party go into the political campaign this fall, with separate tickets Governor C. C. Moore and the whole Republican ticket will be elected. The Democrats need a strong candidate with a real backbone to make the race for them this fall, but such a candidate is not available and we do not believe he will be at the time the convention meets in Twin Falls. This candidate must be opposed to the present exhibition power rates. He must be opposed to the present freight rate which is keeping the people of Idaho subject to exploitation and poverty. If we understand the attitude of Mr. Samuels he agrees with both; these qualifications for reforms in freight and power rates. This should not be the sole basis upon which a candidate should be nominated, by any means, but these should be two of the major requirements as to the qualifications of a candidate on the Democratic ticket.

Think these things over fellow Democrats and then ask yourselves whether you want to stand alone and be defeated or whether you wish to fuse and rescue Idaho from the clutches of the trusts and predatory interests which have controlled this state for years and worked hand in hand with the Republican machine to elect its candidates to go to Boise and sit in the seats of judgment for the people of Idaho.

The farmers are sacrificing their farms, some of the business men are forfeiting their businesses because of this discrimination in favor of the predatory interests in this state and if you seek relief then forget that old born party which has held you in slavery and vote this fall as you feel every loyal American citizen should vote, against the trusts and predatory interests and for the man rather than for the party. The party is only a vehicle through which to get good government and if that vehicle falls into the hands of a few schemers then it is time to forsake that vehicle and try a Ford.

An arrangement of the sort suggested would necessarily have to be by mutual endorsement by the two conventions. The Democratic party will not consent to be swallowed up or to lose its identity and autonomy, and it is fair to assume that the progressive party will not do so either. The question of seniority need not necessarily be included in this arrangement over the state ticket. The Democratic party will not support Senator Borah, though it might back a progressive of the stamp of Dow Dunning, who was the progressive congressional candidate two years ago.

BOY SCOUT COUNCIL IS GRATIFIED

Meeting Yesterday Expressed Delight Over Condition; Fund Will Be Advanced for Purchase of Supplies on Large Scale for the Camp.

A small but enthusiastic meeting of the scout council was held yesterday afternoon at the office of the probate court, where considerable room was available for the gathering.

The council was gratified to learn that the scouts had determined to advance a "resolving fund" for the purchase of supplies in large quantities, and that by buying at wholesale will make the supplies cheaper and at the boys' pay in the end, the money will be coming back.

Pursuant to the report of Scout Commissioner A. J. Peavy of the field department, the council voted to increase its quota of \$1,000.

Chairman of the council, W. H. Nunnell at Burley was considered

and the results shown praised.

The results showed that the eleven members of the council had given over 100 per cent in numbers and over 100 per cent in efficiency.

During the month of June there had been 110 hours of training making 31 in all in the Snake river district 540 scouts had joined and one had been transplanted to the camp.

The total number had increased from 400 to 631.

During the year in the district, there had been 11 new council classes, nine first-class scouts, 37 merit badges and two new star scouts. The total number of merit badges awarded over 100 hours of training had been given—an average of 22 hours to each recipient.

Scouting boards were reported

functioning in every town, council of honor were meeting regularly, scouts were making good progress.

Swimming and life saving classes have been added this month.
