

It is interesting to note the lineup in the senate committee on agriculture on the question of reporting the House bill to lease Muscle Shoals to Henry Ford. Among the 10 voting in the negative was Senator Capper, leader of the farm bloc, while of the six who voted in the affirmative four are from the South.

Should near-sighted children be discouraged from occupations requiring much reading or other close work? That is the view of the council of British ophthalmologists, which favors their disqualification for scholarships and bursaries, but it has caused not a little dissent. Myopic eyes in the long run often hold out better for close work than eyes which tend to far-sightedness. In any case, while eyesight is important, mental aptitude is more important still.

Bank robberies and other crimes against banks this year have been more numerous than ever before, according to a report to the American Bankers' Association, the other crimes having exceeded in number by 48 per cent those committed in the corresponding period in 1923. Strengthening the banks' material defenses and exercising more care in dealing with strangers are recommended. They would be practical measures for reducing crime as well as for guarding against it.

IDaho POWER RECORDS OPENED

The public utilities commission has at last opened to public inspection reports and records submitted by the Idaho Power Company in connection with its new rates of March 1, and also the annual report of the company for the year 1923. This goes into effect today just a month after the commission's demand of the Power Users' Association with evident reluctance served notice on the company to show cause why this should not be done. The attitude of the company in this respect, it would seem, showed little judgment, and was in keeping with its policy of "bluffing through" when its position would not warrant it in doing so. It could have yielded at once with good grace, what it now does under direct command. It will take some time for the attorneys of the Southern Idaho Light Power Users' association to compile facts showing the exact condition of things and this delay may be valuable to the company—an extent that will more than offset the loss of prestige which its policy of delay has entailed. It certainly has postponed the time of re-hearing and possible appeal to the extent which it held out its report.

CAUTION ON USE OF THE FLAG

The following suggestions were handed to us by the Daughters of the American Revolution of this city and are published for the benefit of the public who are anxious to know the correct use of the flag and the Red, White and Blue for decorative purposes.

- Do not permit desecration to be shown to the Flag of the United States.
- Do not dip the Flag of the United States to any person or any thing. The regimental color, state flag, organization or institutional flag will render this honor.
- Do not display the Flag of the United States with the union down except as a signal of distress.
- Do not place any other flag or pennant above or to the right of the Flag of the United States.
- Do not let the Flag of the United States touch the ground or trail in the water.
- Do not place any object or emblem of any kind on or above the Flag of the United States.
- Do not use the Flag as drapery in any form whatever. Use bunting of blue, white and red.
- Do not fasten the Flag in such manner as will permit it to be easily torn.
- Do not drop the Flag over the hood, top, sides, or back of a vehicle, or of a railroad train or boat. When the Flag is displayed on a motor car, the staff should be affixed firmly to the chassis or clamped to the radiator cap.
- Do not display the Flag on a float in a parade except from a staff.
- Do not use the Flag as a covering for a ceiling.
- Do not use the Flag as a portion of a costume or of an athletic uniform. Do not embroider it upon cushionings or handkerchiefs or print it on paper, napkins, or boxes.
- Do not put lettering of any kind upon the Flag.
- Do not use the Flag in any form of advertising or as an advertising sign to a pole from which the Flag of the United States is flying.
- Do not display, use or store the Flag in such a manner as will permit it to be easily soiled or damaged.
