

WOODWARD'S LIFE ATTACKS IN HOUSE SUIT

Dr. Woodward Mayo Badly Scratched by His Wife in Courtroom; Dispute Involves Leading Film Producer.

Democrats Platform Urges Six Constructive Planks

Repeal of Unnecessary Taxes, Regulation of Antarctic Coal Industry, Rehabilitation of American Merchant Marine, Reduction of Transportation Costs, To Open World Markets to Farmers, Membership in World Court Are a Few of Suggested Planks; Underwood Would Have Anti-Klan Plank Also.

UNITED PRESS HEADQUARTERS, Wash., D. C., June 22.—The democratic platform for the coming year was announced by second place in the midst of leaders and delegates on the day before the convention convened.

So fierce has been the battle between the forces contending for the nomination, and so important the democratic platform that it was evident that the question must be settled before the party standard bearer can be picked.

The leading candidate only came in for individual mention in the heated discussions of the plan book. Underwood, Smith, Underwood, and Hoover are referred to primarily with regard to their positions on the plan and other issues.

The studied attempt of party leaders to make "clean government" the main feature of the coming campaign has been all but thwarted. The report of the coming campaign plank will form the basis of the program which the republican administration was allowed into the inferior position along with the issue of national prohibition and other controversial issues.

Leadership in the fight over the plan issue, first raised by George H. Brown, democratic boss of Chicago, to check the candidacy of William G. McAdoo, today stands over Edward H. Rouse, boss of Chicago, the 1920 congressman for James G. Cox. More claims he already has 600 delegates pledged to support a plank denouncing the plan by name in vigorous terms.

The plank proposed by Moore condemns any organization that undertakes to destroy free political action and features racial and religious intolerance to destroy the democratic party to "oppose the activities of the Ku Klux Klan or any similar organization which undertakes to control or interfere with free political action or "op process" of the law.

The plank denouncing the Harding administration regime and pledges the democratic party to drive corruption from public office was drafted.

The same thing will probably happen this year. 'Michael' claims that the 'stay-at-home' vote could elect or defeat any candidate for president. He's right. That's obvious.

Michael's analysis showed that over 25 million citizens, eligible to vote in 1920, failed to go to the polls. The people who did vote totaled 26,137,832, totaling votes cast for all candidates.

And the vote-slackers will the loudest when anything goes wrong in Washington.

Nearly 80 million Germans voted in their national election in May. That's more than vote for president in the United States.

And yet we have nearly twice as many population as Germany.

They take their government seriously over there. They go to the polls and get what they want—instead of staying away and grumbling when government fails to please.

The ballot is the foundation of democratic government. Here in America, citizens by their ballots have virtually unlimited power to make any change they want, and bring about any reform or condition they desire simply by using their ballots intelligently.

Now, if Americans were paid \$5 apiece for voting, how many would stay away from the polls?

And yet failure to vote may cost a citizen a good many times \$5—in the form of inefficient government, high taxes and waste of public funds.

If you stay away from the polls this year, you signify indifference as to what kind of government you live under and what is done with this America of which you are a part owner.

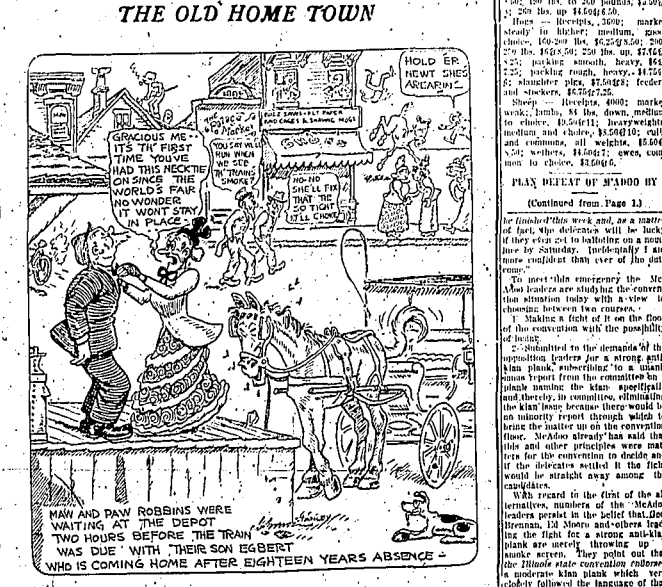
