M'ADDOO OR BAKER LOGICAL CANDIDATES SINCE G. O. P. NOMINATION

The work of the Cleveland convention may reasonably be expected to affect the New York convention somewhat as the republican national convention of 1912, which renominated President Taft, affected the democratic national convention at Baltimore.

There is just enough of a parallel between the situation created by the Chicago convention of 1912 and the situation created by the recent Cleveland convention to raise the question whether the work of the New York convention might not now be given a more "progressive" slant than might have been necessary under other conditions.

It may at least be said that these circumstances make McAdoo look more tempting, in spite of the flaws in his availability, Democrats who believe more strongly than ever that their presidential candidate should be attractive to organized labor, and especially to the great railroad, brotherhood-first, because of LaFollette's strength with those elements, and second, because of General Daves' weakness with them—have found a satisfactory intermediate for LaFollette.

The force of his reasoning with some of the delegates will be granted. We may conceive a rise in McAdoo stock. Yet similar reasoning applies to another progressive democrat who has not been a candidate but who may be included among the dashless possibilities with rather more confidence in his availability since the Cleveland convention nominated General Daves for vice president. The other man is Newton D. Baker of Ohio, secretary of war in the Wilson administration.

Hitherto Mr. Baker seemed handicapped as a candidate in so far as the burden of war-time criticisms of his administration or the army itself weighed him down. It has seemed probable that the aircraft accident of 1918 would become a major campaign issue, and he would be nominated. There would be a new campaign edition of the Hughes report and we should hear vividly repeated from July to November the scorching denunciations that the United States spent hundreds of millions of dollars on its aircraft program but got none of its planes to the battlefield before the armistice.

Baker stock has now gone up a bit because the republicans have nominated Gen. Daves for vice president. Gen. Daves originated the famous "Helen Maria" Daves (rebel) ceremony. "Helen Maria" became of his impassioned defense of the department's conduct of the war under Secretary Baker. There was a republican investigating committee in 1920 that probed Gen. Pershing's command in France along with the war department's management of the war, and Gen. Daves (rebel) secretary staff and served as chief purchasing agent of the American expeditionary force was the star witness. He put that investigation into an overwhelming slip by vindicating the government's presentation of a victorious war. One of his most telling utterances on the witness stand was this:

Long after the work of the committee is in oblivion the accomplishments of the American army will be remembered. I am not a democrat, but I do not feel like picking flyspecks in the war department's conduct of our nation's war secretary. 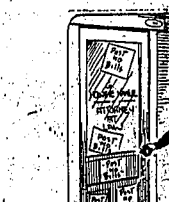
