

MAJORS OF SEATTLE POLICE FORCE

While Mayor Brown is At Democratic Convention the Majors Dismisses Chief of Police and Many Patrolmen and Closes Town Up Tight.

NEW YORK, June 27.—Mayor John H. Brown, of Seattle, threatened on the democratic convention left the morning for his home following reports that the acting mayor had ousted the chief of police and was threatening to dismiss about 100 veteran police officers.

SEATTLE, Wash., June 27.—When Mayor J. H. Brown of Seattle's grip back home he will have a new chief of police to appoint and no one knows how many police officers.

Mrs. Henry Landre, acting mayor, has already removed W. B. Scrymgeour, chief of police and the department is in charge of Captain J. M. Dixon as acting chief.

"Your force has not carried out its duty in suppressing the liquor traffic," Mrs. Landre wrote in a letter received by Scrymgeour.

Maintaining a "reasonable limit of law enforcement" is the duty of the police department and the city government, according to the theories of the mayor, announced in a letter to Scrymgeour.

Seattle's police force has been reduced to 100 men and the city government is expected to dismiss about 100 more.

Regardless of New System of Scoring, the Stars and Stripes Will Go Up More Often Than the Colors of Any of the Other 41 Nations, Says Getty.

By FRANK GETTY. NEW YORK, June 27—America will win the gold medal championship at the Olympic games, with something to spare.

Despite the new system of scoring, destined to deprive the American team of the medals, the minimum number of points required to win the event is four, the Stars and Stripes will go up the flag more often than the colors of any of the other 41 nations.

If this country were represented by but one man, this might be a risky speculation, but with the apparently overwhelming strength of our men, there are three or four teams over there at Paris, enough stars to win two championships in order, if one were to make a conservative estimate.

In this instance, we have eight men, and all so fast that if any of them are out of shape at the moment, they will be in the ring, and there will be no time lost. We have a plethora of short-distance specialists, and the only one of us who does not start in that final.

Colonel Thompson, chairman of the Olympic committee, a genial old soul and a man of the highest character, is enthusiastic on this point as he is on the "American" team.
