A serious international problem still to be solved is that of caring for the Russian refugees of whom a vast number still remain in Greece and other countries near the frontier which are unable to make adequate provision for them. Greece is ready to provide transportation for 100,000 of them whom it can no longer feed; and Uruguay yesterday notified the league of nations of its willingness to accept a large number of them as immigrants, but the numbers involved are large, and it is found that unless radical measures can soon be taken next winter will be a time of great distress. If the United States cannot open its doors it should at least be able to open its pocketbook.

Edward Baxter Dewey, the blind pianist, who died Saturday at the age of 69 at his summer home at Baymont, Me., was one of the pioneers of the lecture-recital, which has come to be so popular during the present century. As early as 1880 he began to recite the numbers on his program with brief comments by way of interpretation, possibly having been led into this innovation by a lameness of the right wrist which, for several years made it difficult for him to play through a long-recital, and which led him at that time to specialize in bravura solos for the left hand alone. He was so good a pianist that it was seldom necessary to make any allowance for the infirmity of blindness, and he was specially praised for his interpretation of Chopin. He was born in Haverhill, in 1855, and studied in Europe. For several years he was a member of the faculty of the Oberlin conservatory of music, and in the last years of his life taught at Union college at Frederick, Md.

A large book might perhaps be compiled of curious incidents due to modern inventions, and one of the oddest was that which befell two English motocyclists the other day when they ran upon a flock of sheep on a mountain road. They all passed except a fine ram which stubbornly held the road, and was so enraged by the honk of the horn that it charged one of the machines which had an empty sidecar. The driver, taken at a disadvantage, hastily dismounted, and the ram energetically butted at the machine until he had driven it over an 80-foot embankment, whereupon he galloped proudly off to join his tailoring flock. The discomfited motocyclist might read with interest, the fantastic book written by a well known English novelist some years ago to show the terrible things that would happen if the rest of the animal world were to be seized like mankind by the war-madness; one of the mysterious deaths described was due to a concerted attack by a flock of sheep which drove a man over a precipice.

PUBLIC HEALTH IS PUBLIC WEALTH

Issued by the Idaho Public Health League, Boise.

Some time ago in a mining town in West Virginia, a sixteen-year-old boy found a little tot three years of age drowning in a spring. The boy resuscitated the baby and performed artificial respiration upon it, thus saving the child's life. The Schaefer method of resuscitation had been taught the boy a few days before as a part of the regular first aid course on his starting to work in the mines.

The toll from drowning is high. An overturn can easily occur, or getting in "beyond one's depth" there are many ways for the one who cannot swim to get drowned. Many of these lives could have been saved by prompt and efficient first aid measures.

There are few sights so pitiful as the wet, pale body of a young fellow stretched on the beach limp and motionless beside his little heap of clothes, surrounded by a helpless crowd. Just think of the opportunity! If one man or boy or girl, possessed of the knowledge of a few simple rules, could step forth from that gazing useless wall of galvanized human posts, that body would be given every chance in the world to live out its years. Every second is an hour; there is little time to run for pulsators or lung motors; a life is in jeopardy, and you are there. With your two arms and hands you can render a big service, if you know how. One swimming director reports drowning cases which he has fortunately brought back to life by the Schaefer method.

In the first place, get "on the job" quickly. Do this by laying the patient on his stomach, face turned to one side so that the nose and mouth do not touch the ground. Draw the patient's arms away from his body and extend them above his head. Kneel beside him or straddle him, with your knees at his hips and facing the head. Place your hands over the outer ends of his lowest ribs, curling the fingers around his body but of your sight. Your thumbs are turned outward, which assists in holding your arms straight. Do not use your arm muscles, but your body weight from the shoulders by bringing your body forward.

Gradually increase the weight (there is no sudden thrust) for three seconds of vertical pressure upon the lowest ribs of the patient, then suddenly release the weight. The rate of operation should be 12 per minute; pressure for three seconds; relaxation two seconds, this makes one complete respiration in five seconds, or 12 per minute. Use a watch or your own deep breathing as a guide. Success is usually attained within 25 minutes, but the resuscitation should be continued without interruption, if there is no response for two hours or more.

INDIA SEEKS HOME RULE ON CANADA PLAN

PEDIGREE STOCK FOR PALESTINE

First efforts to introduce pedigree stock-raising in Palestine have been made by Mr. James Leo Bagshaw, who has gone to the Holy Land to establish a stock farm there.

The stock consists of two thousand Jersey bull calves and a heifer-calf from the farm of Capt. S. L. Kaplan in Westchester County, New York.

Vast Domination Sirs, Will Assemble For Self-Government and Try to Force Immediate Action; Representations to London to Secure Ratification of Canada Plan in Work on League Assembly and Opposed London Visiting Neutrality Conference Given Interim Authorization.

The people of India are preparing to demand in their name legal recognition by Canada, that in order to do this, politicians of various castes are collaborating to smash the caste system, and to force the British to abandon the support of the Indian representative in the assembly of the Indian National Congress, and the national movement. Hon. A. J. Conant, for 18 years a noted missionary in India, who with his wife, are here to help the Indians, has written to the author, Hon. Mr. Conant will speak at the Union meeting next Sunday evening on the work of missionaries in India.

Held Up Taxes

The movement for home rule is being held up by the Canadian government, and the general council of India and of the several provincial councils. They are unable to find time to vote taxes. In this case, their actions mean only bitter delay, since the British rulers over the heads of the local assemblies, the elected bodies, in India.

The present system which missionaries have strived for centuries and which proved a barrier to their efforts, is now being destroyed by the home rule movement, and the politicians find that they must have the support of all classes, including the lower castes, in order to succeed with them, or they will make a fight, with considerable success, to hold on to power for thousands of years. This will open the way for the work of the missionaries to spread the doctrine of the gospel among all men.

Dynastic British Government The League of Nations Assembly is to meet in Paris on July 10, and it is expected that government delegations will be present. A delegation of Indian delegates will be headed wholly on the side of the persons who seek home rule. They oppose the British government's policy, and have received the warmest praise from critics on all the leading papers in the larger cities of both India and England.
