BLACK CANYON POWER PLANT MAY BE BUILT

U. S. Reclamation Department May Invest \$450,000 For This Project to Irrigate Genoa District; Engineers Favor It.

BOISE, Idaho, July 1.—The United States reclamation service will invest \$450,000 in a power plant at Black Canyon dam to supply turbine power for the irrigation of the Genoa district lands in southern Idaho. The reclamation service has made with the landholders of the district and the state board of land commissioners. This was the important information that U. S. reclamation service director of the reclamation service on the occasion of his visit to Boise, this week.

The status of the agreement, if it can be worked out satisfactorily to be to the government \$300,000 appropriated by a special act of the 1923 legislature for reclamation of state lands within the Genoa district.
