In some parts of England the curious old practice of "beating the bounds" is still kept up, and was called into notice the other day by the drowning of several children through the capsizing of a boat on the river Evenlode. Presumably in these degenerate days the children are no longer flogged at each boundary stone to impress the old landmarks of the parish on their memory.

Germany's protest to the League of Nations against the occupation of the Saar basin by French troops in place of the special police contemplated by the treaty of Versailles is not the first, but this time something may come of it. The council of the League deferred action until August, and with more conciliatory policies in vogue in France it may be possible to dispose of this vexed question.

Australia is becoming an important wine producing country, and this year has a record vintage of over 10,000,000 gallons which is hard to dispose of. It consumes 3,000,000, and much more is required for the manufacture of spirits, but this leaves a huge surplus, and as southern Europe could testify the world market is badly depressed. The wisdom of the bounties given by the Australian government may be questioned.

Geneva already feels the new wind that is blowing in Europe. As representative of France, Henri de Jouvenal heartily welcomes steps by the council of the League of Nations toward making the League responsible for the disarmament of Central Europe under the treaties. The transfer may not be immediate but with France no longer opposed, the insuperable obstacle disappears. It is a significant change which may have large consequences for good.

Theodore DuBois, who died last week in Paris at the age of 87, was a composer of distinction as well as a celebrated organist and teacher; for 53 years he was a teacher in the Paris conservatory, of which he was director from 1896 to 1905. He composed a number of operas and ballets, as well as symphonic works for orchestras, but is most widely known by his organ works and his church music, including a setting of "The Seven Last Words of Christ." He continued into old age his work as a composer.

The Republican does not approve the bad manners of the persons at the Cleveland convention who shouted, "Down with Lodge," "Put Lodge Out!" It was a new experience for the senator, however, and he will have ample opportunity to reflect upon the significance of it. A by-product that he must appreciate is the presentation of a key to the city by Mayor Curley of Boston.—Springfield Republican.

Many millionaires attend directors' meetings just to get the \$5 goldpiece that is paid for attendance.

We smile at the man who wastes \$10 of time trying to recover a lost \$1. And yet we all do the same thing in principle.

We continue to use worn-out devices long after they become more expensive than new devices. For instance, many a farmer—rather than buy a new faucet for his oil barrel—uses the leaking old faucet. He collects the drippings in a tin can, but by evaporation loses every few weeks more than the cost of a new faucet.

Supposed economy oftentimes is extravagance.

No matter how much or how little money we have, our greatest wealth is time. Nature gives us just so many minutes to spend between birth and death.

The precious minutes are ticking away fast. But how many squander their most valuable minutes? It's foolish

to overwork. Man needs to spend minutes as well as dollars for recreation to keep him balanced and efficient mentally and physically. Few of us, though, spend our spare time as shrewdly as we spend our spare money.

Money fortune depends on not being spendthrift with time, quite as much as on saving money.
