

REBELLO BRAZIL ABOUT QUEZ'S CLAIM

Insurrection Position Has Become Critical and Free Communication Between Sao Paulo and Capital Is Complete; Other Report Is Serious.

RIO DE JANEIRO, July 10.—Newspapers were eagerly awaited here today of the final report of the military rebels, which have held a part of the city of Sao Paulo since last Saturday.

It was expected the remaining rebel position would fall today, if it has not already been captured.

A local troop sent against the rebels in Sao Paulo now are in full contact with the superior command perfectly organized, says the latest official communication.

The situation of the Insurrection has become more and more critical. Normal communication between the city of Sao Paulo and Santos has been restored and there is nothing to interfere with free movement of the people in the district.

The lines of the Central Brazil railway connecting Rio de Janeiro with Sao Paulo were interrupted between Minas and Sao Paulo, but have since been restored and the railway system in operation again practically on a normal basis.

The Luz military barracks is the only point in Sao Paulo left in the hands of the enemy.

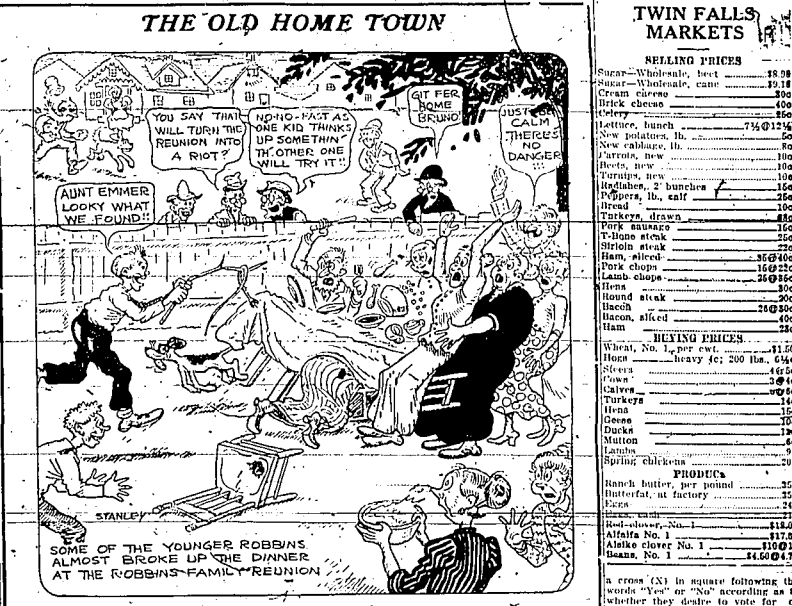
