The New Electric Rates

Established By the Public Utilities Commission of Idaho for the Idaho Power Company

THE prevailing rates for electric service, which have been established by the Public Utilities Commission, have equalized the cost for the same service in all communities of southern Idaho, and give customers served by the Idaho Power Company, the lowest rates for electric service charged by any utility in Idaho.

In December, 1923, the commission said that the Idaho Power Company was entitled to a small increase in rates amounting to 1 3/4 per cent, but the rates that have been established by the commission have resulted in an actual reduction in the average rate received by this company during the first four months after the new rates became effective, as shown by the following figures:

- Price received by this company during the months of March, April, May and June, 1923, under the OLD RATES, for all current sold in Idaho. **1.45 Cents Per Kilo-Watt Hour**
- Price received during the months of March, April, May and June, 1924, under the NEW RATES, for all current sold in Idaho. **1.44 Cents Per Kilo-Watt Hour**

This result does not show the complete effect of the NEW RATES as sufficient time has not elapsed to show the effect on seasonal service, but is published at this time so that the public can be informed of the results to date.
