WHEAT IS UP SO IS FLOUR

Liverpool and London Doubtful About How Long Present Market Values Will Be Maintained; Chicago Quotations Held Responsible to Some Extent.

(Copyright 1924, by United Press.) LONDON, July 30.—Speculation in the wheat market in the United States has been followed by similar rises in the price of wheat and flour in England.

Flour in English markets has jumped 10 shillings a sack since July 14, and 24, mountain 29 federal troops wounded but gives no figures as to the dead or the extent of the relief campaign.

The standard four pound British loaf, already increased from the old eight penny price, will jump to ten pence next Monday.

To the English farmer what war is profitable for the first time since the war but in the great majority of the population—the "live" earner—the high price of bread means only an added strain on the family budget.

Spectacular advances in flour prices during the present months have caused consumers to start speculating for resumption of the wartime practice of government wheat buying, but the president of the board of trade, Sidney Webb, is not optimistic.

According to the latest report to the government board of trade, the situation is as follows:

"The outlook at present is the uncertainty of the Canadian crop to which may be attributed the recent rise in grain. This outlook undoubtedly has been aided, as is usual in such circumstances, by market speculation.

"There seems no reason to believe at present that the coming season will be under requirements. Although prices for 4 time may continue at higher levels than during the corresponding period last year, there is no justification now for expecting periods of shortage or over a scarcity of wheat."

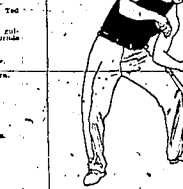
