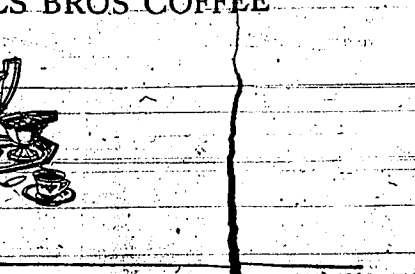

The story of the league of nations and its forthcoming activities in securing world-wide military and naval disarmament will be read with interest.

BACK POWER FIGHT

Now that the question of reasonable rates for the Idaho Power company has gotten into the federal courts, through the action of the company itself, every political party should pledge itself in good faith to back a project for sufficient legislative appropriation to carry the fight in behalf of the people to a successful conclusion.

THE RAILROAD LAW AND DEMOCRATS

Expressing accord with the announced purposes of the Eech-Commins transportation act of 1923, this plank contends that not failed to accomplish them.

Railroad freight rates should be so adjusted as to give the bulky, basic, low priced raw commodities, such as agricultural products, coal and ores the lowest rates.

In holding that the Eech-Commins law fails to accomplish the lofty purposes which those who drafted it professed and in asking radical alteration of the measure, the democratic party is simply adhering to the policy which it has adopted with reference to this measure.

At the close of hostilities, Director William G. McAdoo, who had rescued the railroads of the nation from the chaos into which they had fallen when he took charge, suggested that the period of government control be extended for a term of five years under peace conditions.

This advice was neglected until toward the close of congress when the Eech-Commins law was pushed through the lower house.

An overwhelming majority of democratic votes supported a resolution to reimburse for amendment, and when this failed a very large majority of democrats voted against the measure on final passage.

But on the democratic vote alone the measure would have been defeated. The republican vote against it was negligible.

A few days before the expiration of the time limit, President Wilson, signed the measure, accompanying his signature with a scathing denunciation and declaring that it was only because he was confronted with the alternative of chaos that he affixed his name to the measure.

The democratic national platform of 1920 likewise denounced the Eech-Commins law.

The demand for reduction of freight rates on agricultural and mining products in the democratic platform of this year was placed in accordance with the necessities of these industries.
