A July of \$54,690,334 in building permits issued to 79 cities of the Pacific coast during June indicates a continuance of the con servative policy on the part of builders which has marked the rec ords of the past-three-months Students-of-business economics ommeing this situation with the extensive insiding activities of the previous year, consider it indicative of a very healthful condition destined to prevent a threatened overbuilding and to maintain a stable balance in improved properly values as well as in em ployment of labor.


