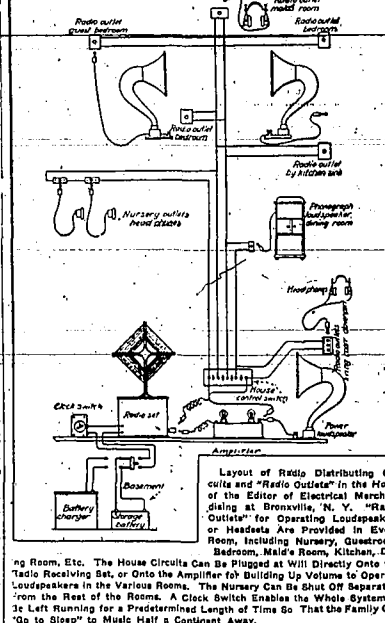
I know that somewhere you exist,

IDAHO DROUGHT HAS ADVANTAGES

The serious drought that has visited the west and Idaho during the past few months is not without its value. It has forced a conservation of water and a revision in the irrigation of lands that has been generally beneficial. It has resulted in search being made for additional water for irrigation purposes with the result that many wells have been drilled and a large volume of water, which heretofore has not been put to beneficial use has been made available to the salvation of crops.

These facts are clearly illustrated in the reports that come from Parma, for instance. Residents of that city invented a water filter. It has not been in heavy demand until this year but the water shortage has resulted in many of the filters being placed to advantage for the elevation of water to irrigate crops. Many new wells have been sunk in not only the Parma section but in many other sections of the valley. These have added materially to the flow of water for irrigation purposes and have been of decided advantage to those who are short of water, in some instances saving their crops.

Adversity, in other words, has caused us to find some way of overcoming the unexpected obstacles that have been thrown across our path. We have succeeded to a certain extent. The present is an exceptional year. But if it should repeat itself we should not in the future encounter serious difficulty in solving the question of securing an ample water supply for the irrigation of our lands.—Capital News.

WHAT KIND OF EDUCATION IS THE FARMER PAYING?

A high school in a community in a western state supported almost entirely by agriculture is giving eight-tenths of one percent of its teaching effort to agriculture. It is giving 14 times as much of its teaching effort to foreign languages, as to agriculture. Yet this community will rise or fall according to the degree of intelligence brought to bear upon agricultural problems.

The country has been stirred from center to circumference since 1920 because of acute problems growing out of the agricultural situation. The best minds of the country have found the problems so complex that little agreement as to proper solution exists. Ought not the schools especially in such communities as are primarily dependent upon agriculture give a large part of their effort to training that will help directly in the solution of farm problems? Ought not farmers themselves solve their own problems? Can farmers ever be certain that proper measures are proposed when they originate with other than farm groups? If you school so organized that a reasonable amount of effort is concerned with the solution of farm problems? If not, why not?

HOME AND AUTOMOBILE INVESTMENTS

The tendency on the part of the people to buy automobiles either for pleasure or for use in their business, usually to the advantage of both, has produced the stock argument on the part of those who are deprecating it that it is generally detrimental. The figures do not bear them out. Indeed quite the contrary is true, a fact that is decidedly of advantage to those who happen to be engaged in the automobile business.

It has been proven that savings accounts in Idaho and the country over are on the increase rather than the decrease and now comes the statement from an expert in the manufacture and sale of synthetic lumber that investments in small homes in the United States has increased 12 to 1 faster than investments in automobiles in the past five years.

Building and loan association figures show an increase of nearly \$1,500,000,000 in assets since 1919 while wholesale prices of automobiles have increased only \$120,000,000 in the same period. As we have been unduly alarmed by the figures that there are two and one-third times as many automobiles in the United States as there are income taxpayers and that there is an automobile for every income above \$1000.

Improvement in building technique is making homes better and cheaper the same way that manufacturing skill is making more and cheaper automobiles. Synthetic lumber in boards 2000 feet long later cut up into convenient lengths, enables a style of building that can reduce the cost of a small home 20 per cent and give a handsome and more efficient house. Invention is and ever will be not only better in every way but cheaper. A large proportion of this great war of automobile owners in America, especially in the country, keep their cars in their own garages next to their homes.—Capital News.

KEEPING WELL

FATIGUE
DR. FREDERICK H. GREEN
Editor of "HEALTH"

WHAT is fatigue? What happens when we get tired? Everybody knows the sensation, but just how it is caused? What does it mean when we say that we are "all in," and just what has happened to us?

In the first place, we have probably not had enough fresh air, or putting it the other way around, we probably have had too much air that wasn't fresh, too much stale, vitiated air. We have probably stayed too long in rooms that were overcrowded or overheated.

Then our eyes have probably been exposed to glare from unshaded lights that fatigue the muscles of the eye and make us feel tired.

Or perhaps we have been sitting too long on uncomfortable chairs or benches.

It doesn't matter whether we have been in an office, a factory, a theater, sitting too long at a time on seats that are improperly adjusted to our bodies in sitting, whether we are working or playing.

Maybe our clothing is uncomfortable, in spite of the freedom of present-day dress, such as the flapper costume, for instance, many people still wear uncomfortable clothing, especially uncomfortable shoes, which restrict the muscles and cause irritation and fatigue.

Perhaps we have been sitting too long, watching too long, playing too long and have so tired out the group of muscles without resting them by using another group.

Or we may have been surrounded by persons who were irritating or annoying, or by those who have heard us, so that we have been under constant mental irritation.

Any one of these things will tire us out, a combination of two or three or them will, of course, increase the fatigue.

When one is tired, his resistance to disease is lowered, so his susceptibility to infection is increased. The sensible individual, when he is unusually tired, instead of going to the theater, the ballroom, or the crowded public places for recreation, will lie down in a quiet, cool, well ventilated room and rest until his mental and physical balance is restored.

He will then be not only in better condition to enjoy his recreation, but he may also guard himself against possibility of a serious illness.

EXERCISE HINT



Lying prone upon the floor, and clasping hands behind the back, feet raised from the floor, then twist the body from the waist to the left as far as you can, or illustrated, making several attempts, to bend still farther; then make the same movement, twisting to the other direction.
