ST. PATRICK'S, La., Aug. 25.—Sweeping down from a calm sky late yesterday, a cyclone demolished St. Phillips, La., which a church member said had been built to withstand wind and danger, and reportedly killed eight persons and injured more than a score.

The twister descended shortly after the community's gathering, when it was said many of them had departed for their homes, otherwise the toll might have been greater.

**LOWER RATE
IS ORDERED TO
THE TETONS**

**PUBLIC Utilities Commission Orders
Sweeping Reduction of Freight
Schedule to the Samuel C. Max-
well Co. of 70 cents a Ton, for
Twin Falls.**

**INTERSTATE COMMISSION—Declaring un-
reasonable and excessive, the rates
now in effect charged by the Oregon
and Idaho railroads for the trans-
portation of coal from the Teton
county coal mines to Idaho
points, the public utilities commission,
in its order issued last Saturday,
has suspended the carriers' right
to charge such a substantial one, in its
stead, effective immediately.**

The rate to Twin Falls was cut
from \$1.10 as fixed by the railroad
to \$1.00, the Burley rate was cut
from \$1.40 to \$1.30.

The company's schedule was filed
in the commission office in the
establishment of rates in the
middle of last month. The sched-
ule was filed July 12, to become af-
fective three days later. The com-
mission's order that "the rates were
suspended" was a hearing at the Teton
trial, August 4, at which evidence
was taken.





It is the republican New York Herald Tribune which complains bitterly of political interference—not by the executive branch of the government, but by members of congress—with the policies and decisions of the United States shipping board. Chairman O'Connor denies the charge, and says that the board stands in the same relation to the emergency fleet corporation that the directors of any corporation hold in relation to the president. The shipping board seems to be sounder in theory than in practice.

Arguing that railroad employees could not expect higher wages under government ownership, the Railway Age cites the average yearly compensation of all railroad employees in this country under government operation. In 1918, it was \$1419, and in 1919, \$1486; last year, under private management, it was \$1619. This evidence also helps to dispose of the reckless charge that Mr. McAdoo and his successor as director-general paid exorbitant wages during government control. Exchange.

A Washington dispatch to the Boston Herald contains a statement "made public" by the secretary of the American Economic Institute of Chicago to the effect that Mr. LaFollette's movement is dominated by railroad labor leaders who are not only unkindly of the interests of the farmer and congressmen the names of men who voted for the McNary-Haugen bill and other farm-relief measures. This is no new discovery. In an editorial on the 2d, the Railway Age showed that the "progressives" were blacklisting men like Senator Cappa and Representative Koch, who had worked for measures beneficial to the farmer, and insisted that Mr. LaFollette's campaign was being conducted by labor leaders whose real interest was in promoting the Howell-Balkley bill and other measures believed to be injurious to the railroads.

PLATFORM AND CANDIDATES

There are two important things which the democratic convention must attend to when it meets here tomorrow. First, it must select a platform and, secondly, it must nominate candidates who will pledge themselves to support that platform.

In national affairs it should stand squarely with the national ticket. It may well pledge itself to the plank of the 1922 platform which endorsed a regulation of discounts of the federal reserve act preventing either undue inflation or undue contraction. It should take firm stand against privilege.

In state affairs it should pledge a return to democratic economy. It should specifically promise to carry into effect, if entrusted with power, the great legislative measures supported by the democratic senators and representatives last winter in the legislature for the non-partisan judiciary and the making effective of the constitutional provision for direct legislation.

It should take steps toward the submission of a provision in the constitution for better marketing facilities for farmers and for putting into effect all that the present constitution permits.

It should take a stand on a conservative and just revision of the mining tax law, without going to the extent of discouraging legitimate production.

It should demand the enforcement of the anti-trust law and of the fair-trade law. It should stand a stand on power. There is now pending a constitutional provision which if enacted will enable subsequent legislatures to enact laws that will control the matter of exporting power from the state thereafter. This should be pursued. But since it will take time to get it into effect, the platform should specifically approve of steps being taken to protect the people in the courts in their fight for equitable power rights.

Another thing: When James H. Hawley was governor of Idaho, law giving limited tax exemption on homes constructed in the state was enacted. It was repealed under his republican successor. This law, a step in the right direction, should be re-enacted.

An aggressive campaign by an able campaigner on these principles can draw to the united democracy the support of the people and do more than merely hold the party organization intact in a moribund life. It is worth fighting for.

In 1904, Alton B. Parker, a good and really progressive man, ran for president on a platform of revision, drafted by David D. Hill. We all know what happened to him. The democracy of Idaho can win with sound men on a sound platform. Otherwise it must lose.
