NATION'S CHIEF IS CONDEMNED BY BROOKHART

Coolidge and Entire Republican Party Scored in Address of Senator From Iowa; Has No Intention of Bolting.

EMMETTSHURG, Ia., Oct. 3.—Declaring that President Coolidge belongs to the "Wall street bloc" and that the leadership of the republican party has forsaken the cause of the people, Senator Smith W. Brookhart, republican farm bloc leader, in a speech here today, launched an attack upon President Coolidge and his administration. While he did not call for the casting of the vote of no-confidence in the cause of the Pollard-Wheeler ticket, Senator Brookhart made it clear that he would not support Coolidge and took a position on the issues of the campaign in opposition to the president. Three times in his speech he mentioned Senator Robert La Follette in a favorable light.

At the same time he clearly denied reports that he was bolting the G. O. P.

"I have never had a thought," he said, "of leaving the party."

Brookhart said in part:

"The issue now arises as to whether the principles of the republican party shall be determined by the voters themselves or by a small group of crooked and irresponsible dictators who are in the non-partisan league in Wall street."

HUERTA DESIRES TO QUIT, REPORT

Ex-Provisional President Is
Ready to Retire From
Public Life.

LEONCIA, Tex., Oct. 3.—Alvaro Obregon, former provisional president of Mexico is ready to retire from active public life, according to dispatches to a Tribune Spanish language newspaper here today.

Simultaneously, dispatched, said Obregon, who is a member of the Carrancista party in the state of Durango, had revolted as a protest against the recent presidential elections.

**Johnston to Confer

The Twentieth Century Club has started its year's work and they have mapped out quite a remarkable program for this year's thought and consideration. Many civic problems will be considered by this organization during the next few months and we believe that much good will come from the discussions of this group of women who have set their faces toward the rising sun. The work of this club is helping worthy students through school is certainly commendable in the extreme. There are hundreds, of boys and girls in Idaho who would like to attend schools of higher learning but for one reason or another which is usually financial, are prohibited. Every business man who can should set aside a small amount of his surplus each year to help educate the young men and women who so much desire more advanced education and who are unable to obtain college education. Such an education should not consist of the training of head alone.

AN UNFORTUNATE DECISION

As a means of getting votes for LaFollette, a better method could not have been chosen than that adopted by the supreme court of California when in a decision rendered last week, they informed the people of California that they could not vote for the independent candidate for president in the same manner in which the democrats and republicans vote for their choice.

This in face of petitions containing hundreds of thousands of names of California voters requesting that the names of the LaFollette and Wheeler candidates be placed on the ballots. These independents believed they were complying with the law, which specifically states that "this law should be construed in the most liberal sense, in order that the will of the people may be complied with to the fullest extent."

Americans, as a rule, are most fair minded in cases of this kind; the supreme court decision is being condemned on all sides by democrats, republicans and independents alike, regardless of party affiliation. There are thousands of California voters who have been on the fence as far as the presidential choice is concerned, who will undoubtedly swing to LaFollette.

The best way to strengthen a candidate in the eyes of the people is to treat him unfairly, or manifestly so; it saves his supporters to take up the cause with a fighting determination to win if given them the best possible issue, where they had none before, and adds thousands to his supporters who will vote for him merely because they believe him to be the victim of unfairness.

The four to three decisions of supreme courts nullifying the will of the people happens to be one of the main issues of the LaFollette party, and the decision of the court only serves to strengthen this platform plank.

With Coolidge holding only a scant margin over LaFollette in California in the two nation-wide polls now being conducted, the decision of the supreme court may be the means of carrying California for LaFollette. But in order to vote for the Wisconsin his California supporters will be forced to stamp a cross after the name of the socialist presidential electors who are pledged to LaFollette.

The decision is a most unfortunate one from most any angle you choose to take it; for one man to tell 150,000 or more voters they can't vote for their choice for president, will never set well with the American people—Elko (Nev.) Free Press (Rep.).

The decision of the California court is one of the sort that has aroused popular sentiment against the review power of the courts. It is the kind that has made the democratic party in numerous declarations oppose what the platform of 1896 called the union of judicial, legislative and administrative functions in the person of the judge. It is the sort that in 1912 made Theodore Roosevelt make a race on a platform favoring the recall of judicial decisions, and has put the recall provisions in several state constitutions.

While congressman from Virginia, John W. Davis, was instrumental in getting the anti-injunction clauses into the Clayton act, and the principle might be extended. His present platform and speeches indicate that he still stands there.

Unfortunately resounding against occasional judicial usurpation has led to demands that would so hamper courts as to destroy the balance which has been the glory of the constitution and the protection of minorities. A constitutional amendment which would make it possible to recall five to four decisions setting aside statutes and which would curb the abuse of injunctions would maintain the powers and dignity of the judiciary and at the same time prevent judicial usurpation of the rights of other branches of government. The progressives and socialists demand much more than this.






