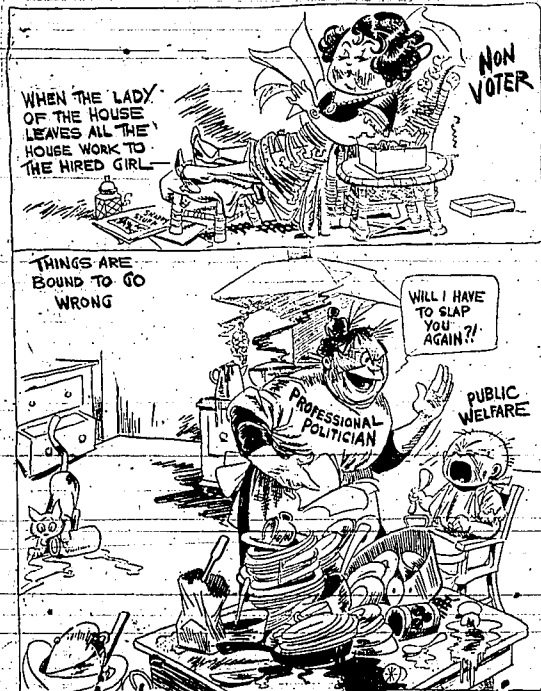

CHINESE WAR NEARS CLOSE; HSIANG FLEES

Defenses Before Shanghai Collapse As Yuan's Forces Advance on City; Civilian Population in Panic-Stricken

SHANGHAI, Oct. 12.—The war in China continues with an end in sight and Chang Tso Lin has lost a valuable ally. General Lu Hsiang-feng, head of the board of defense, fled on board a Japanese vessel while the Chinese defenses before Shanghai collapsed.

General Lu Hsiang-feng's forces are advancing without opposition, to take possession of Shanghai. The Chinese position outside the foreign settlements are panic-stricken and are attempting to enter the concessions.

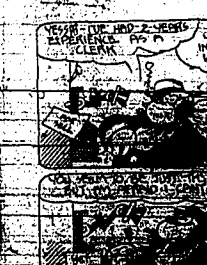
