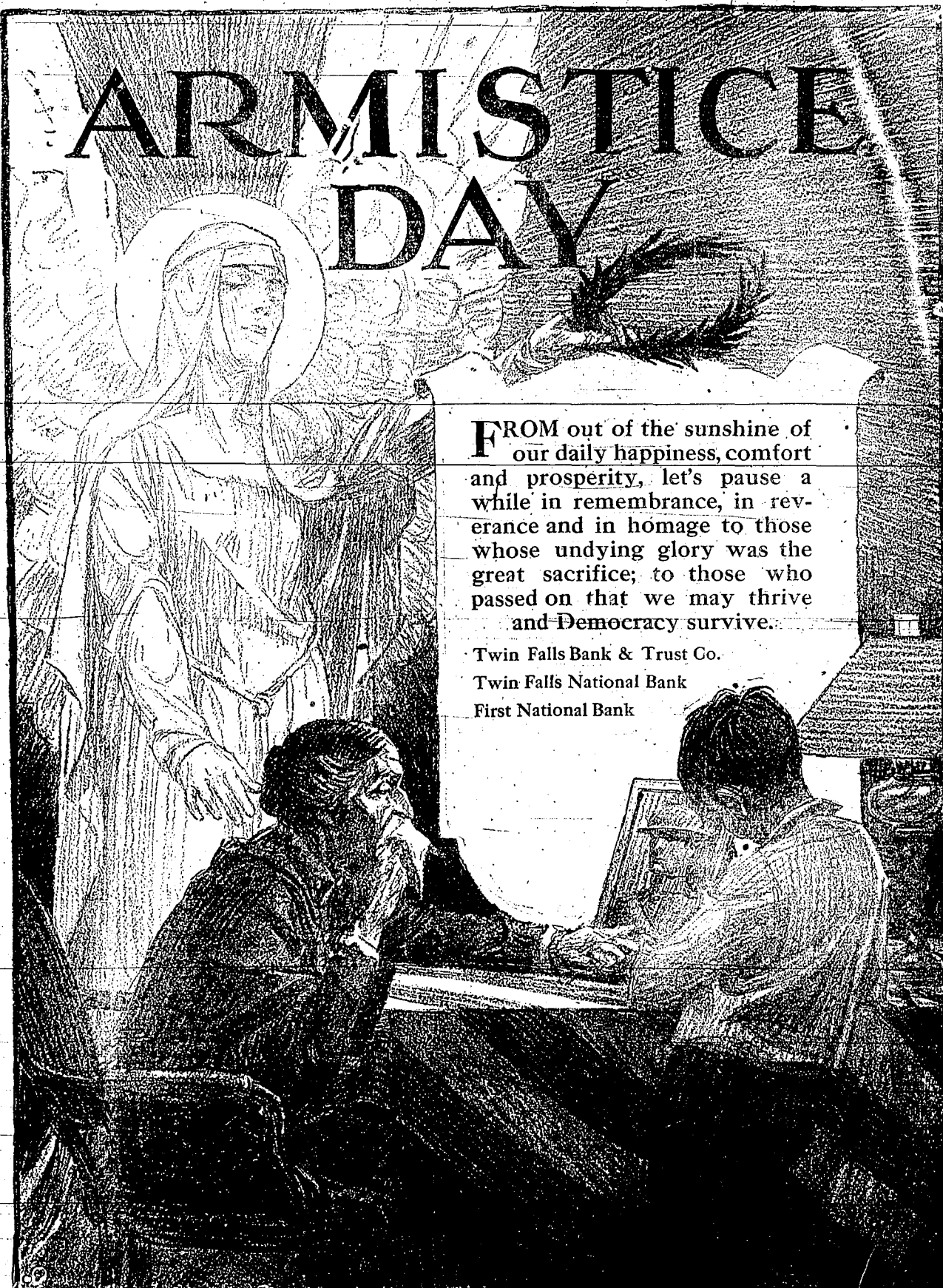
Argument Over Birth Control Becomes Warm

APPROPRIATION TO ADVERTISE IDAHO'S IDEA

Secretary Daulton Puhls to move in front of the legislature to get appropriations for the Idaho State Fair.

Pressing the idea which he has been preaching persistently ever since he returned from the Idaho State Fair, Secretary Daulton Puhls, of the Idaho State Chamber of Commerce, is urging all Twin Falls people to avail of the Idaho State Fair to advertise the county and to the feasibility of appropriating from the legislature for that purpose. He points to the fact that the state legislature has appropriated for the purpose of an organized effort to get appropriations next year.

"It was a shame for anyone to bring such exhibits as some delegations from other states did and then turn down at that show in comparison with ours," said Mr. Puhls, "and we can not get up an exhibit with sufficient funds and have it at the big livestock and agricultural shows and state fairs."

"Those, which raises crops that are inferior to others has started a movement to attract immigration with an ample fund. It is expected to be in the hands of the legislature in a few months."
