WHEAT SELLS HIGHER IN CANADA

The indisputable fact that the price of wheat in Winnipeg is today lifteen cents above that in Chicago furnishes conclusive evidence that when the farmers of a section organize into a co-operative movement they have at their comband a tremendous power for their own betterment. It is only a little more than a year since the Canadian farmers began organizing their wheat co-operatives and at that time their cash grain prices were considerably lower than American prices. Here is a part of what the Scoop Shovel, a Manitoba publication, has to say on the situation:

situation:

The joke is on the United States farmer. He went after, and he got, a tariff of 42 cents per bashel on wheat to protect him against Canadian competition. The United States farmer hoped by his tariff protection to get 40 cents a bushel more than the Canadian farmer; he is actually getting less. The wheat pool has the tariff skinned a mile.

WALL STREET AND UNBELIEF

A quite remarkable editorial was published in the Wall Street Journal recently under the caption, "Our Un-It read in part:

Whence-could a reminder of this grave condi-tion (the world's materialism) come with better grace than from Wall Street? The spiritual is fundamental; the material has no value and, indeed, no basis without it.

The article in question deprecated what it denomi-The article in question deprecated what it denominated a spurious democracy, and impod that even those who should know better have contributed to destroy the faith in a Supreme Being which is nowhere in the letter of the Constitution of the United States, but which permeates the whole of it. And it asked in conclusion: "Are our preachers sure that they have grasped the strength and meaning of the religion they water and sugar to sait their own weak faith? Is our trust in God only valid when we stamp it on a piece of money?" Such thoughts are worthy of mature consideration. worthy of mature consideration.

CONTROL OF DRUGS

The present world conference on onium should be watched by Americans with social interest, as the drawed is worse here than in any western nation. Our delegates will need not only enthusiash, but also knowledge. Particularly they will have to realize that there is a nucli surer road to protecting this country from snuggling than trying to control the habits of India and China. Switzerland has been under such pressure from the League of Kations that she will probably sign the opinin convention this year, and tighe does a long step alread will have been taken. Some of the biggest shipments of forbidden drugs, disguised as commodities, have been coming from Switzerland. The center of the Swiss narcotic business is Basel, which has been made a free city, not subject to national regulations, been made a free city, not subject to national regulations, and since Basel was made a free city the corporations dealing in inarcotic drugs have taken leases on nearly half the warehouses in the city.

Another place where opium is manufactured into morphine for export is Japan, and most of it is sent to

morphine for export is Japan, and most of it is sent to China, against the wishes of the Chinese government. The factories are the places where control can be easy and effective. There are not many of them, and it is easy for any nation that licenses them to know exactly what is going on.

France is among the countries that need pressure on France is among the countries that need pressure on the drug question. Although it has accepted the League's program it has not put it into force. Popplies are being grown in increasing numbers in southeastern Europe, and converted into morphine and hieroin in this country and in France. The Persian supply is very large. Of the world supply, of about 3500 fors, Europe and the United States are seriously affected by only about 700 tons, is low-grade. that does not affect our problem.


