

DEATH CLAIMS LABOR LEADER IN TEXAS CITY

Samuel Gompers Passes Away This Morning at 4:05; Takes a Sudden Change for Worse; Was Man of Capabilities.

SAN ANTONIO, Tex., Dec. 12.—Samuel Gompers, veteran president of the American Federation of Labor, died here at 4:05 this morning. Gompers was taken ill in Mexico City and returned to the United States. He arrived here at 5 o'clock yesterday afternoon and although his condition was critical, physicians were hopeful that he would recover.

He took a turn for the worse, however, and death resulted this morning. Death occurred in the St. Anthony Hotel where Gompers was taken from the special car in which he arrived here.

According to Dr. W. S. Cockrell, Me physician who accompanied him here from Mexico City, Gompers' death was due to a condition which had been acute about a week. He had been taken to a hospital and a half and which was aggravated by the high noon heat of the city. It is believed that the labor leader had gone to attend the Pan-American labor conference.

In a bulletin issued at 10 o'clock last night, the last official statement issued before Gompers' death, the attending physicians declared that there had been no change in his condition and that there was every indication he would spend a comfortable night. At 12 o'clock, however, there was a sudden change in his condition and he died peacefully at 4:05.

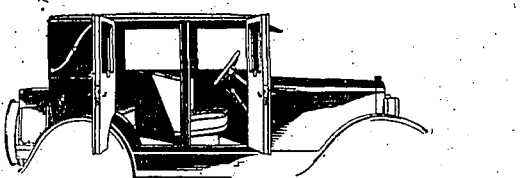
