Sawtooth Precipitation to End of December Is More Than Fall in 1923.

BOISE, Jan. 16.—The snow which covered the high drainage basins of Idaho at the close of December last year was generally more extensive and of greater depth than those obtaining at the same date in 1923, according to a statement issued Wednesday by Clinton E. Norquist, secretary of the government weather bureau.

Mr. Norquist said: "Over most of the state the snowfall has been heavier than normal and in all sections the fall has been much greater than for the same period last year. In the Sawtooth region the snowfall for the season in the end of December was practically equal to the total fall for the winter of 1923-24."

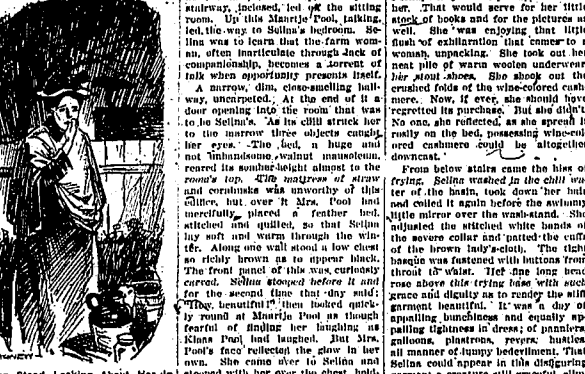

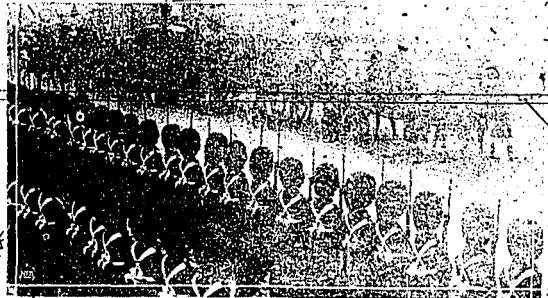

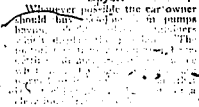

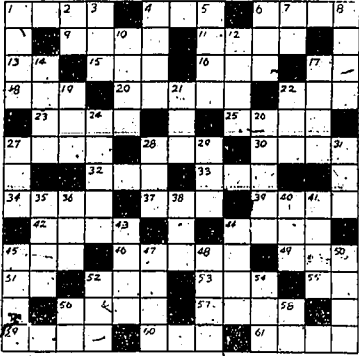

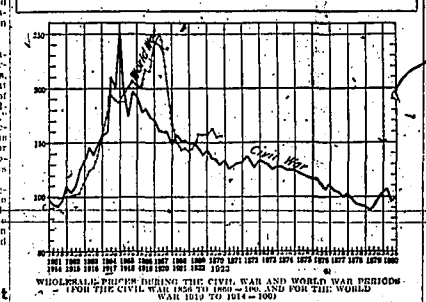
