



HOSPITAL RULES ARE NOT LEGAL

**Prosecuting Attorney Holds That
Unless Permission Shall Be
Granted to Osteopaths and
Chiropractors to Practice, Reg-
ulations Are Void; Assignment
of Room for Them Would
Be Sufficient.**

That any rule which excludes osteopaths or chiropractors from practicing who have a license to practice according to the state and county laws is illegal, so far as any public hospital maintained, as the "Twin Falls Hospital," is concerned, party leaders, was the opinion given orally this afternoon to the board of county commissioners by G. F. Springer, attorney for the former board on January 10, by County Attorney J. W. Taylor, Mr. Taylor having been called in to advise him to maintain the standardization rules and would in addition make provision for a separate room in which osteopaths and chiropractors might be licensed if patients, the rules, thus amended, would be legal. He promised to call on the commissioners at an early date for their opinion later. It is not known what action the board will take.

ATTORNEY GENERAL'S OPINION.

In a letter received today, Attorney General A. Conner advises that the rules of the hospital and osteopaths and chiropractors might be illegal and therefore from saying no positively. He says:

"I am not prepared to say whether or not it would be a reasonable regulation or regulation to exclude chiropractors and others from practicing in the hospital.
