

SUN'S ECLIPSE TO BE STUDIED BY SCIENTISTS

Inhabitants of Eastern Section of Nation to View Spectacle Through Smoked Glasses and Powerful Telescopes.

NEW YORK, Jan. 23.—The attention of something like 25,000,000 inhabitants of the eastern part of the United States and Canada will be focused tomorrow morning upon the eclipse of the sun.

A vast, white-colored shadow will sweep across the continent from the Atlantic coast to the Pacific, and the astronomical phenomenon, visible once every 75 years.

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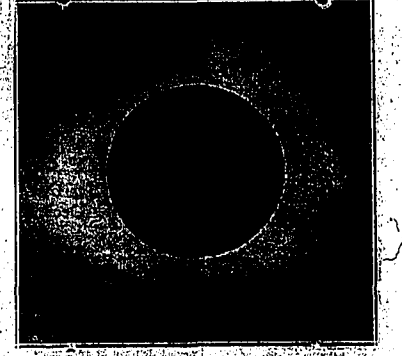

**Dairymen Give Out Report for December**

The following brief monthly report of the Twin Falls County Dairymen's association for December was made public by L. S. Otto, secretary, for release on Thursday.

Total butterfat delivered to creamery, 40,296.89 pounds. For this there was paid to the patrons, \$182.05 making an average return for December of 44.02 cents per pound butterfat. Delivery of 6,904 pounds butterfat, 47.57 cents per pound.

At the close of December, 607 patrons were delivering cream to the association with a total delivering 22,018.96 pounds butterfat from 240 patrons.

The Clover route has been consolidated with the Flax route with Ernest Jerman as collector. Several weather conditions were met in December, but notwithstanding a difficult encounter, 97 per cent of the cream delivered to the creamery averaged "premium."

The return of butter is steadily increasing, as this is delivered back to the patrons at cost of production.

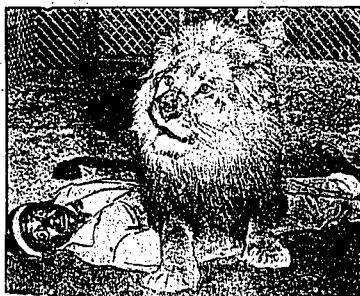

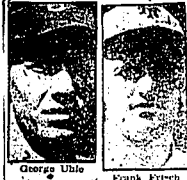

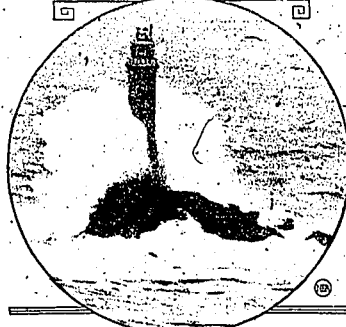

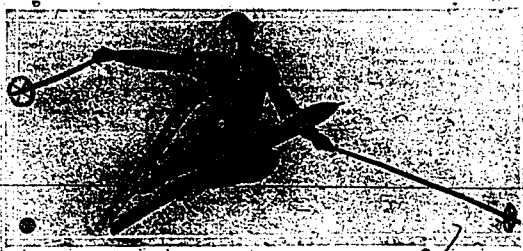
