

Agitation for a change in the Black law, which would repeal the provision compelling cities operating under commission form of government to grant franchises with-out putting them up at public auction seems likely to meet the fate of other meritorious propositions which were introduced in the present legislature; only-this proposition

Undoubtedly intended as a protection to the public when inserted into the law, it has never proven to be such.

enacted it was a sample of legislative ignorance of economic law, which is too characteristic in Idaho. The error
in this case is the assumption that such bids to the extent
that they realize cash, are in the nature of relief to the
public. The fact is that the consuming public not only
always pays the bid, but it is presumed to pay it, legally,
and so far as the law is just, morally.

Some years ago in the course of a bitter attack on the
public utilities commission a speaker in the Idaho legislature pointed out that when Boise accepted an offer of a
premium to permit consolidation within the city of electric lines operating in the valley, the company petitioned
the commission and got leave to charge higher fares to
pay the bonus granted the city of Boise. When asked how

silenced. In fact it could not legally be paid in any other
