





A LEGISLATIVE OUTRAGE IN IDAHO

On the ground of economy, the republican majority in the Idaho legislature has decided that no bills proposing laws for guarantee of bank deposits or direct primary, introduced by any democratic or progressive member, shall be printed. In order to understand the full meaning of this action, it is necessary to be informed of the history of the tase and the procedure in a legislative body.

history of the case and the procedure in a legislative body. In the state of Idaho there is probably no single proposition more thoroughly established than that a majority of the people favor a direct primary law and a bank guariantee law. More than one election has verified this statement far beyond the peradventure of a doubt. Persons in a good position to know place the proportion of voters who so believe as at least 80 per cent and many estimate it as high as 90 and above. At any rate, it is conceded by all informal persons that the majority who thoroughly believe in the justice and equity of these propositions is overwhelming. overwhelming.

ly believe in the justice and equity of these propositions is overwhelming.

At the last two elections the democratic and progressive parties went on record strongly in favor of the enactment of these principles of government. In the legislative session two years ago and in the one now in session, representatives of those parties have introduced measures proposing to enact the principles into statute.

When a bill is introduced into the legislature, before it may be considered on the floor, it must be referred to the principle of the decision of the flower of the state and placed on the desks of the members it cannot be discussed nor even mentioned. Officially, it is not yet "before the house." And so, the action of the republican caucus in the Idaho legislature is, in effect, a refusal to consider bills which a large majority of the voters of the state have asked to have not only considered but enacted into Jaw. They may not even be discussed and their objects explained. In plain language it is gagging the representatives of a majority of the people of ladho, and refusing discussion of measures dear to their hearts.

No more arrogant assumption of authority has even been attempted in a deliberative hout.

Here is a bunch of men representing the political minority of the voters of the state, insolently declaring that no measure affecting the interests of the state can be considered in the legislature unless it be introduced by a member of the republication.

History records that certain kings, who claimed to rule by "divine right," attempted to obstruct the progress of mankind and prevent enactment of just legislation by strangling discussion of proposed laws. They succeeded in delaying matters, but it was only temporary. Some times the king's head was mislaid while discussion was in progress. Majorities, especially majorities gained by division of the opposition, may assume the same kind of kingly prerogative, but the onward march of progress can only be delayed. It can never be stopped, no matter how self-satisfied and arrogant may be the attitude of the obstructionists. Idaho voters have been patient with the party that persistently sets itself against all forward looking legislation, even to the extent of denying the right of discussion. It will be interesting to know how butch long or this patience can be strained.
