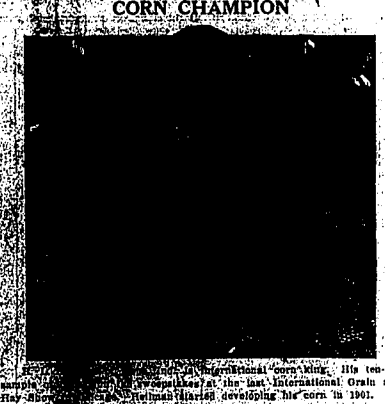

BOOSTING IDAHO IS A SURE CURE FOR BLUES

Boosting is contagious. Try it on your neighbor the next time you see him. Get into a conversation about the qualities of your home community, about its superior...

Boosting is so contagious, so easy to acquire and does so much good when it finally spreads, that all of us ought to throw ourselves in the path of the germ and become inoculated with it.

A few days ago, the following article appeared in the Idaho Falls Daily Post. It tells the story of progress in a little Idaho community, that ought to make some of the other places feel pretty small.

Can't you notice the difference, the different atmosphere after you have read it? Here is what was said: "We have no hard times at Ammon. We raised 13,280 tons of beets on 1000 acres of land and they will bring at the present price of beets, over \$100,000, of which 85 per cent will remain in the community as most of the labor was done by children and local help," says Leonard Ball.

"We also grow potatoes and grain as well, keeping a good per cent of our land in alfalfa so that sheep and stock may be fed on the land to help keep it in a high state of fertility. The alfalfa is broken up and potatoes put in, then follows two or three years in beets, then seeded back to alfalfa. Thus making a rotation that keeps the land in a high state of cultivation."

"We also have a cheese factory running full capacity, as our farmers have learned that there is money in a few good cows on the farm to help make a market for the hay and by-products of the sugar beet."

"We have room for some good farmers, as some of our farms are too large, but we do not want the ones who sit BACK AND HOWL about hard times. We have no time to wait for congress to legislate for our salvation, all though we would appreciate some relief from that source, but we have learned the way and we are going on."

Mr. Ball said a few very complimentary things about their schools and how the students cooperated by working in the beet and potato fields in the fall, which we are forced to leave out for lack of space, but we believe a good idea of Ammon's boosting spirit can be gained from a reading of Mr. Ball's interview.

Ammon probably has no more advantages than the scores of other communities in south-western and central Idaho, but its boosting spirit is acting as a magnet to draw attention to it.

There is an indication of the spirit that all communities need—it attacks prospective home-seekers to it, knocking acts as a damper—it chills the newcomers' attitudes toward the community and people in it.

People who knock ought to leave the country. The railroad are operating train service for the accommodation of those who think the rainbow of promise is just over the hill. The knocker ought to get rid of his holdings—even if he has to give them away to get rid of them—and make room for those who want to come in and in a legitimate way put their shoulders to the wheel and push. Any one dissatisfied with his home community is a chump, and wasting a lot of life to remain, when the world covers so much territory. There surely remains some place to the liking of the knocker—some place where the crepe hangers are in the majority and where they can have their own way.

Let's try the boosting game a while: we know that knocking is detrimental and results might be forthcoming by way of boosting! Don't you think it worthy consideration?—Exchange.
