

IDAHO FAILS TO RATIFY CHILD LABOR MEASURE

House of Representatives Defeat Measure Today After Long Bitter Debate; Vote, 38 Against and 18 for the Amendment.

BOISE, Feb. 7.—Idaho was added Saturday to the states refusing to ratify the federal child labor amendment. The House defeated the resolution for ratification by a vote of 38 to 18.

At the top of the House calendar for the day, the amendment was debated, a long session, concluding the entire session.

House bill No. 215, amending the constitution to secure further protection to commissioners.

LOS ANGELES, Cal., Feb. 7.—Official investigation of the "millennium" which failed to materialize as predicted by Mrs. Margaret W. Rowan, leading prophetess of the Reform Society, was announced today by the Los Angeles authorities.

Some of the disillusioned followers that they had disposed of their earthly possessions in anticipation of the world's end are still active.

One Disposed of All. One disbeliever, according to investigators, disposed of all his property, including his clothing and other possessions.

Young Albanian Wins Easy Victory Over Mike Ferris; 'Fat' Wins Title
