



We might go on at quite a lengthy, appeal as to why this school should be located in Southern Idaho, but people might get just about as tired of reading this dope as they do those arguments presented by the Gate City. We have everything that Pocatello has and a lot more, so legislators should think about Twin Falls when they get ready to move this state institution.

It is hard to get enthused over the prospect of mov-ing the state agricultural school from Moscow to Pocatello.

The arguments in favor of it are good enough to deserve weighing, however. There is the very old argument that a state which depends upon irrigation for its agricultural prosperity should not tack its school of farming away in the rolling hills of a rainfall area. 
