

We reproduce without a credit line some of the pert sayings of one of our Boise newspaper writers who does not seem at all satisfied with the accomplishments and the attitude of our state legislature.

Twin Falls folks showed their patriotism in the celebration of Washington's birthday anniversary. Practically every organization and many of the churches held special exercises in honor of this remarkable man who blazed the trail for a true democracy in America. It is remarkable how many different phases of his life can be used to bring out creat lessons. bring out great lessons.

We are not in the habit of predicting how elections will go, but we feel confident that the people of Twin Falls will give a vote of confidence to our schools today by voting in favor of the special tax levy by an overwhelming majority. Generally speaking we are against such special tax levies and in favor of economy of the strictest type, but we feel that it would be poor economy to curtail our schools in this manner.

Every contest, leaves its sore spots. Today, as the result of controversies in the Idaho legislature, of a more or less sectional nature, there are sore spots in Idaho's heart. Will they become more aggravated, or will time serve to heal the heart and compose the mind?

It seems a pity, at a time when the state had begun to climb out of the slough along with the rest of the country; when there was an increasing feeling of amity between state sections and when the public mind had just begun to grasp the true significance of the cilitoria Isogan, "No North, No South—Just Idaho," that anything should occur to start a sponge, with its obliterating smean, across the cur to start a sponge, with its obliterating smear, across the slate of state unity.

Discussion of the contributing causes is not intended here, nor desired. The fact fermains that the condition exists. The big question staring us all in the face is: What shall we do about it?" Shall the fight be continged, with state division as among the possible issues to grow from it, with a bitter church fight and with the state rocked and shocked and set back for a decade or more?

Whatever the answer shall be, it is to be written by the moving finger of the people themselves. And the thought comes to mind, that, after all, there may not be in the popular mind so much rancor, so many evidences of a determination to blow the ship, as seems to be denoted from a more or less individual angle.

And it will be written can way on the other for weal

And it will be written, one way or the other, for weal or for woe. It is surely a subject to which the most serious thought should be given before the verdict is recorded unchangeably.

Sometimes a fight is unavoidable. If it is necessary, therefore, for Idaho sections to array themselves bitterly one against the other, perhaps the soomer the bettr. If it is necessary for one industry to array itself against others bitterly, perhaps the sooner the better. 'A sore tooth is better out than aching.

The thought should not be lost sight of, however, before the war starts, that there will be disaster to all, for a time at least, regardless of who wins; that the fair ship of Idaho, torn and riddled, will not be for many years the majestic institution many had hoped for; that a house divided against itself cannot stand.


